A. Barlow, Private, Co C 46th (Crabtree's) Regiment AR Cavalry, probably 46th AR Infantry Regiment Mounted, organized in late 1864, Colonel W. O. Coleman, surrendered May 11 1865.

A. Barlow, Corporal, Co A 27th MS Infantry.

A. B. Barlow, Sergeant, Co K 24th GA Infantry, original records filed under Albert B. Barron.

A. B. Barlow, Private, Co B Hughes' Battalion MS Cavalry.

A. B. Barlow, original records filed under William L. Barlow, Private, Co I 26th NC Infantry, organized at Crabtree, Wake Co NC on Aug 27 1861, surrendered at Appomattox Court House VA on Apr 9 1865.

A. C. Barlow, Sergeant, Co G 1st Local Troops GA Infantry, demoted to Private.

A. C. Barlow, Private, Co H 4th TN Infantry, organized at Germantown, Shelby Co TN May 15 1861, furloughed 30 days on Jan 5 1865

and rejoined army at Bentonville NC Mar 19-20 1865, consolidated with other units and redesignated the 3rd TN Infantry Consolidated at Smithfield NC Apr 9 1865.

A. D. Barlow Jr., Private, Co H 9th MS Infantry.

A. E. Barlow, Private, see E. A. Barlow.

A. J. Barlow, Private, Co H 2nd LA Reserve Corps.

A. P. Barlow Jr., Private, Co I 6th KY Infantry, enlisted Oct 28 1861 at Franklin KY, died of disease Oct 22 1862 at Knoxville TN.

Abram Barlow, born Jan 28 1834 [JH], died Feb 9 1896 [JH], Private, Co B & K 37th NC Infantry, organized at High Point NC Nov 20 1861, surrendered at Appomattox Court House VA Apr 9 1865.

Alexander D. Barlow, Private, Co C 1st VA Infantry Reserves, organized by consolidating Averett's and Farinholt's Infantry Battalion of Reserves on Aug 12 1864.

Alexander Barlow, Private, Co H 22nd MS Infantry, promoted to Corporal, served 1861-65, wounded, pension application no. 3814 filed Aug 6 1902 as resident of Craighead County AR, died Nov 22 1902, widow Martha Ann Barlow's pension application no. 3814 filed Aug 8 1903 in AR.

Alfred Barlow, Second Lieutenant, Co F 13th TN Cavalry Regiment, organized as partisan rangers Sep 1862, Colonel Mounce L. Gore, surrendered at Washington GA on May 11, 1865.

Andrew J. Barlow, Private, Co A 23rd VA Infantry Battalion, organized with 5 companies Jan 15 1862, also known as the 1st Infantry Battalion, disbanded at Christianburg VA Apr 12 1865.

Anslow H. Barlow, Private, Co I 3rd VA Infantry, organized at Portsmouth VA Apr 20 1861, surrendered at Appomattox Court House VA Apr 9 1865.

Arthur Barlow, Private, Co E 1st (Nelligan's) LA Infantry.

Arthur W. Barlow, Private, Co A 30th GA Infantry.

Benjamin Barlow, Private, Co A 23rd VA Infantry Battalion, organized with 5 companies Jan 15 1862, also known as the 1st Infantry Battalion, disbanded at Christianburg VA Apr 12 1865.

Benjamin Frank Barlow, Private, Co D 5th Cavalry Battalion AL Hilliard's Legion, organized with 3 infantry, 1 artillery and 1 cavalry battalion at Montgomery AL Jun 25 1862, 5th Cavalry Battalion transferred Dec 30 1862 to Co D 10th Confederate Cavalry Regiment which was formed by consolidating the 19th Battalion GA Cavalry and

the 5th Battalion Hilliard's Legion AL Cavalry.

Bryant P. S. Barlow, Private, Co B 7th Battalion MS Infantry.

C. Barlow, Private, Co F 38th MS Cavalry, bur Mt Zion Cemetery, Wesson, Lincoln Co MS.

C. C. Barlow, Private, Co A 1st Battalion (McNair's) MS Cavalry.

Charles C. Barlow, Private, Brook's Company of AL Cavalry Reserves. Perhaps AL Hardie's Cavalry Battalion Reserves, organized with 5 companies Sep 7 1864, surrendered at Citronelle AL May 4 1865. Or perhaps AL Thomas' Cavalry Regiment Reserves, organized probably in 1864, disposition unknown.

Charles G. Barlow, Private, Co B 10th KY Cavalry, also Co B 11th KY Cavalry U.S.A.

Charles G. Barlow, Forage master, 4th LA Infantry.

Charles P. Barlow, Private, Co D 19th (Biffle's) TN Cavalry Regiment, organized Oct 3 1862, Colonel Jacob B. Biffle, surrendered at Gainesville AL May 12 1865.

Chauncey M. Barlow, Sergeant, Co D Waller's Regiment TX Cavalry, promoted to Second Lieutenant.

Christopher Barlow, Private, Co D 5th KY Cavalry, enlisted Sep 2 1862 at Lexington KY.

Christopher Barlow, Private, Captain Byrne's Co KY Horse Artillery.

D. Barlow, Private, Co I 24th AL Infantry, organized at Mobile AL Oct 15 1861, consolidated with the 28th AL Infantry and the 34th AL Infantry and designated as the 24th AL Infantry Consolidated at Smithfield NC Apr 9 1865.

D. B. Barlow, Private, Co I 1st FL Infantry, organized and mustered into Confederate service for 12 months at Chattahoochee FL on Apr 5 1861, failed at reorganization Feb 1862, men who reenlisted organized into four companies as 1st FL (McDonell's) Infantry Battalion in Feb 1862.

Daniel J. Barlow, Private, Co G 13th MS Infantry, promoted to Captain.

Daniel M. Barlow, Private, Co B 3rd AL Infantry Battalion Hilliard's Legion, organized with 3 infantry, 1 artillery and 1 cavalry battalions at Montgomery AL Jun 25 1862, transferred to Co A 60th AL Infantry which was organized by consolidating the 3rd and 4 companies of the 1st AL Infantry Battalions, Hilliard's Legion, at Charleston Nov 25 1863, surrendered at Appomattox Court House VA Apr 9 1865.

Darling Barlow, Private, Co A 3rd MS Infantry Battalion and Co B 7th Battalion MS Infantry, captured by Union forces at Franklin TN on November 30, 1864, enlisted in the

Union Army to avoid prisoner of war camp and mustered into Co F 5th U.S. Infantry as Private on April 6, 1865.

David D. Barlow, or D. E. Barlow, or G. E. Barlow, Private, Co C 19th Battalion GA Cavalry, transferred to Co D 10th Confederate Cavalry which was formed by consolidating the 19th Battalion GA Cavalry and the 5th Battalion Hilliard's Legion AL Cavalry.

David H. Barlow, Private, promoted to Second Lieutenant, Co I 15th NC Infantry, organized as the 5th NC Infantry Volunteers, mustered into Confederate service at Garysburg, Northampton Co NC Jun 11 1861, redesignated 15th Infantry on Nov 14 1861, surrendered at Appomattox Court House VA Apr 9 1865.

E. Barlow, Private, Captain Mallet's Co NC Infantry. Probably Co K 3rd NC Artillery Regiment, Captain Edward Mallet commanding, organized in Craven Co NC in early 1862, became Co C 61st NC Infantry Regiment in Nov 1862, 61st NC Infantry Regiment was organized at Wilmington NC Sep 5 1862, surrendered Orange County NC Apr 26 1865.

E. A. Barlow, Private, Co H 23rd AL Infantry, organized at Montgomery AL Nov 5 1861, regiment surrendered at Vicksburg MS Jul 4 1863, paroled later in month and declared exchanged Nov 1863, consolidated with the 31st and 46th AL Infantry Regiments and designated the 23rd AL Infantry Regiment Consolidated on Apr 9 1865.

E. D. Barlow, Private, VA Carolina Light Artillery Battery, Captain Thomas Rowe Thornton, organized in Caroline Co VA Jul 23 1861, surrendered at Appomattox Court House VA Apr 9 1865.

E. P. Barlow, Private, Co I 25th TN Infantry, organized at Camp

Zollicoffer, Overton Co TN Aug 10 1861, Colonel Sidney S. Stanton, surrendered at Appomattox Court House VA Apr 9 1865.

E. V. Barlow, Private, Co F 39th GA Infantry and Co B 56th GA Infantry.

Edward Barlow, Private, Co A 3rd LA Infantry, promoted to Sergeant.

Edward I. Barlow, Private, Co D 9th KY Mounted Infantry, enlisted Oct 21 1861 at Abingdon VA, promoted to 4th Corporal, promoted to 4th Sergeant on Dec 1 1862, promoted to 3rd Sergeant on Sep 25 1863, died of disease in 1864 at Montgomery AL.

Elbert F. Barlow, Private, Co K 64th NC Infantry, organized by increasing 11th Infantry Battalion to a regiment in 1862, captured with most of the regiment at Cumberland Gap MD on September 9, 1863, enlisted in the Union Army at Louisville KY to avoid prisoner of war camp.

Elias Williams Barlow, Private, Co D 2nd AL Light Artillery Battalion, organized at Mobile AL Nov 8 1861, regiment surrendered at Vicksburg MS Jul 4 1863, paroled later in month and declared exchanged Nov 1863, broken up and enlisted men assigned to Barret's MO Artillery Battery Nov 19 1863.

Elijah O. Barlow, Private, Co D 33rd AR Infantry, organized Jul 11 1862, Colonel H. L. Grinstead, surrendered May 26 1865.

Eliphet Barlow, Private, Co K 50th NC Infantry, organized at Camp Mangum, near Raleigh NC on Apr 15 1862, surrendered at Durham Station, Orange Co NC Apr 26 1865.

Elisha Barlow, Private, Co C 19th Battalion GA Cavalry.

Elisha Barlow, Private, Co B 14th Battalion GA Light Artillery and Captain Anderson's Battery GA Light Artillery.

Elisha A. Barlow, Private, Co D 17th MS Infantry.

Elisha M. Barlow, Private, Co G 2nd AR Infantry, organized spring of 1861, consolidated with other regiments into the 1st Infantry Regiment Consolidated on Apr 9 1865, surrendered Apr 26 1865 in NC.

Enoch Barlow, Private, Co B 36th MS Infantry.

Eugene Barlow, Private, Co I 5th KY Cavalry, enlisted Sep 2 1862 at Georgetown KY.

Fletcher D. Barlow, Private, Co K 7th LA Infantry, promoted to Second Lieutenant.

Frank Barlow, Private, Co I 10th KY Cavalry.

Frank Barlow, Private, Co E 12th MS Infantry.

Frank Barlow, Private, Co E 36th MS Infantry.

H. F. Barlow, Private, Co G 2nd AR Infantry, organized spring of 1861, consolidated with other regiments into the 1st Infantry Regiment Consolidated on Apr 9 1865, surrendered Apr 26 1865 in NC.

H. M. Barlow, Sergeant, Co H 14th Confederate Cavalry which was organized in Sep 1863 by consolidating Garland's Battalion MS Cavalry, Cage's Battalion LA Cavalry (Miles Legion), Captain Rhode's Co MS Partisan Rangers and Captain Mullen's Co LA Scouts & Sharpshooters.

H. P. Barlow, Private, Captain Buck's Co MS Cavalry.

H. P. Barlow, Private, Co A 1st (Patton's) MS Infantry.

Hamilton Barlow, Private, Co H 58th NC Infantry, organized in Mitchell Co NC Jul 24 1862, also known as the 58th Partisan Rangers, surrendered as the 58th Consolidated Infantry Apr 26 1865.

Harmon Howard Barlow, Private, Co C 2nd (Duke's) KY Cavalry, enlisted Aug 29 1862 at Glasgow

KY, promoted to 1st Corporal Oct 11 1862, captured on Jul 26 1863 at Salineville OH, prisoner of war at Camps Douglas and Chase.

Harrison Barlow, Private, Co B 14th Battalion GA Light Artillery and Anderson's Battery GA Light Artillery.

Harrison H. Barlow, Private, Co C 26th NC Infantry, organized at Crabtree, Wake Co NC Aug 27 1861, surrendered at Appomattox Court House VA Apr 9 1865.

Henry Barlow, Private, Co I 154th Senior Regiment TN Infantry Regiment, organized Shelby Co TN May 14 1861, Colonel Preston Smith, designated as the 2nd TN Infantry Consolidated Apr 9 1865.

Henry D. Barlow, see David H. Barlow.

Henry R. Barlow, Private, Co C 19th Battalion GA Cavalry, transferred Dec 30 1862 to Co D 10th Confederate Cavalry which was formed by consolidating the 19th Battalion GA Cavalry and the 5th Battalion Hilliard's Legion AL Cavalry.

Horace Barlow, Private, Co G 12th MS Infantry, promoted to Sergeant.

I. M. Barlow, Co A 18th (Newsom's) TN Cavalry Regiment, organized by the consolidation of Newsom's Cavalry Regiment and four companies of Colonel Jeffrey E. Forrest's 4th AL Cavalry Regiment May 11 1864, Colonel John F. Newsom, consolidated with the 20th TN Cavalry and designated as the 19th and 20th TN Cavalry in Mar 1865.

J. Barlow, Private, Co D 1st Infantry Battalion NC Junior Reserves, organized with three companies at Camp Holmes, near Raleigh NC, May 25 1864, fourth company, D, added Jun 15 1864, consolidated with the 6th Infantry Battalion NC Junior Reserves

James Barlow, Private, Co A 3rd Battalion FL Cavalry, transferred to Co A 15th Confederate Cavalry Regiment which was formed Sep 24 1863 by consolidating Murphy's Battalion AL Cavalry, 3rd Battalion FL Cavalry, Captains Arrington's & Barlow's Co AL Cavalry, and Captain Smith's Co FL Cavalry.

James Barlow, Private, Co A 6th GA Infantry.

James Barlow, Private, Co E 2nd (Duke's) KY Cavalry, enlisted Jul 15 1862 in KY, transferred to 9th KY Cavalry [see James M. Barlow].

James Barlow, Private, Co H 3rd MO Infantry.

James A. Barlow, or James R. Barlow, 1st Lieutenant, Co D 12th MS Infantry.

Barlow, Private, Co B 3rd Battalion Hilliard's Legion AL Volunteers. organized with 3 infantry, 1 artillery and 1 cavalry battalion at Montgomery AL Jun 25 1862, 5th Cavalry Battalion transferred Dec 30 1862 to Co D 10th Confederate Cavalry Regiment which was formed by consolidating the 19th Battalion GA Cavalry and the 5th Battalion Hilliard's Legion AL Cavalry

James E. Barlow, Private, Captain Croft's Battery GA Light Artillery.

James E. Barlow, Private, promoted to Sergeant, Co H 37th VA Infantry, organized Apr/May 1861, surrendered at Appomattox Court House VA Apr 9 1865.

James L. Barlow, Private, VA Carolina Light Artillery Battery, Captain Thomas Rowe Thornton, organized in Caroline Co VA Jul 23 1861, surrendered at Appomattox Court House VA Apr 9 1865.

James M. Barlow, Private, Co C 9th KY Cavalry, enlisted Jul 21 1862 at Crab Orchard KY, died Jan 16 1863 at Newman GA [see James Barlow].

James M. Barlow, Private, Co B 5th SC Cavalry.

James M. Barlow, age 23, Private, Co A 15th VA Infantry (company mustered in April 23, 1861, as part of 23rd Light Infantry Regiment; became part of 3rd VA Infantry on May 24, 1861; and became the 15th VA after the battle of Big Bethel), paroled on April 9, 1865, at Appomattox Court House VA.
