The Barlow Loyalists of New Brunswick

Joanna Barlow was born on August 22, 1751, at Sandwich, Massachusetts [Vital Records], and was baptized on September 15, 1776, at Amenia, Dutchess County, New York [Church Records]. She was a daughter of Nathan and Joanna (Swift) Barlow and was a descendent of George Barlow of Sandwich (Joanna⁵, Nathan⁴, Peleg³, Nathan², George¹). She died on January 11, 1832, at Kingston, Kings County, New Brunswick, Canada.

Joanna Barlow married Thomas Ganong on August 6, 1769, at Amenia [*International Genealogy Index*]. He was born in 1744 near Lake Mahopac, Dutchess County (now Putnam County since 1812), New York, and was a son of Isaac Ganong. He died in June 1810 at Kingston, New Brunswick. Joanna moved with her husband to Midland, Kings County, New Brunswick, Canada, as a Loyalist and they were granted land at Kingston [*The Loyalists of New Brunswick* by Esther C. Wright]. Their children were: Mary Ganong; John Ganong; Isaac Ganong; James Ganong, born March 21, 1781; and Thomas Carleton Ganong, born March 8, 1785.

Henry Barlow was born around 1694, probably in England. He was a ship's captain. He died on December 18, 1739, at age 45, at Boston, Massachusetts, and was buried there in the Granary Burying Ground.

Captain Henry Barlow's arrival in New England is not recorded. It was, however, before 1730 when his daughter was born at Boston. He was married but only her first name, Rachel, is known. Their children were:

i. Rachel Barlow was born on February 4, 1730, at Boston [*International Genealogy Index*]. It is believed that she moved to New Brunswick, Canada, as a Loyalist and that she died there unmarried on September 12, 1812, at age 82, at Fredericton [*New Brunswick Royal Gazette* September 17, 1812]. In her newspaper death notice she was named as an aunt to Mrs. Emerson.

ii. Rebecca Barlow was baptized in 1733, probably at Boston. She married Thomas Brown of Boston on December 29, 1762, at Boston [*International Genealogy Index*].

He was born in 1720 and was a son of Thomas Brown (died in 1776) of Lynn, Massachusetts. He died in 1792. He was a Loyalist during the Revolutionary War and it is believed that he served in DeLancey's Brigade. He and his family subsequently moved to St. Andrews, Charlotte County, New Brunswick, Canada. Their son, Henry Barlow Brown, was born on July 12, 1764, at Boston; resided and practiced law at St. Andrews; and died on February 9, 1858, at age 93 years 7 months at Woodstock, Vermont [*St. Andrews Standard* February 24, 1858]. He was a schoolmaster in Charlotte County, a barrister and a registrar of wills and deeds for Charlotte County. Henry Barlow Brown married Rebecca Appleton, who was born in 1766, was a daughter of Samuel and Mary (Wentworth) Appleton, and died in 1853.

iii. Henry Barlow was born on January 29, 1737, at Boston [*International Genealogy Index*]. Nothing further is known about him, although he, also, may have moved to Canada as a Loyalist.

Ezekiel Barlow was a Loyalist from Pennsylvania who settled at Parrrtown (Saint John), New Brunswick, Canada, following the Revolutionary War. He was a shipwright and a blacksmith. He was evacuated from New York City on the *William* which arrived at Navy Island, New Brunswick, on May 18, 1783. He was first granted 200 acres of land on the Kennebecasis River, Kings County, New Brunswick, on July 6, 1784, and was later a resident at Saint John [*The Loyalists of New Brunswick* by Esther C. Wright]. He eventually established himself in the West Indies trade and became a prominent liquor merchant at Saint John.

Ezekiel Barlow became the purchaser of the lot on the corner of King Street and Market Square, which was later occupied by the

Western Union Telegraph Company. The locality was called "Barlow's Corners." The purchase price was £2000 and it was stipulated that it be paid in cash with Mexican dollars so Ezekiel brought the money to the attorney's office in a wheelbarrow. Ezekiel was a grocer, a tea merchant, a ship owner and one of the first directors of the first social club organized at Saint John.

The *Albion*, which was a ship of 96 tons was built at Granville, Nova Scotia, was owned by Ezekiel Barlow and his sons Thomas and Ezekiel, and was registered on January 7, 1824. The Barlows were perhaps the largest merchants and ship owners of Saint John in their time.

The *Biographical Review of the Province of New Brunswick* gives Ezekiel, Jesse, Joseph and Grace as the children of Ezekiel, but a Thomas is also mentioned as being "in business with his father and brother":

i. Joseph Barlow was born in 1761 probably in Pennsylvania. He died on May 8, 1809, at age 48 at Saint John, New Brunswick [*New Brunswick Royal Gazette* May 11, 1809], and was buried there in the Old Burial Ground [*New England Historic Genealogy Register*]. He was a carpenter and a loyalist, and he and Thomas Barlow, who was probably his brother, were evacuated from New York City on the ship *William* in 1783, at the end of the Revolutionary War. He and his family of five went to Shelburne, Nova Scotia. Later that year they moved to Saint John, New Brunswick, where in a grant of 1786 he received land on the Long Reach of the Saint John River. They later settled at Portland Parish at Saint John.

ii. Ezekiel Barlow was born about 1766 probably in Pennsylvania.

Emmett Virgil BARLOW, son of James and Ellen Jones BARLOW of Butts County, Georgia, was born in 1838 and grew up on the "Barlow Plantation" there near Indian Springs. In 1860 Virgil BARLOW moved to Carroll County, Georgia, where he married Susan C. BURROW. Shortly after his marriage Virgil enlisted in Company B of the 56th Regiment Georgia Infantry and he would see action in the Western theater of the War Between the States. After the war Virgil and Susan lived and raised a family in the Carroll County area. Virgil and Susan BARLOW had the following children:

i. George V. BARLOW, born 1862, enumerated in 1900 Carroll County Census. No other data known for George.

ii. Amelia M. BARLOW, born 1866, no data for Amelia.

iii. Francis E. BARLOW, born 1869, married George W. Parker.

iv. William Sylvester BARLOW, Born 1871, married Claudia Nichols, was a sawyer in western Georgia and eastern Alabama area.

v. Nancy L. BARLOW, born 1873, married William S. Leak.

vi. Mary J. BARLOW, born 1876, married Robert Chapman.

vii. Arthur W. BARLOW, born 1879, married Genie THOMPSON, no other data for Arthur.

Any information on this BARLOW family would be most helpful, especially the families of George, Amelia and Arthur BARLOW. I am also seeking old photographs of this BARLOW family if such exist. Anyone that has information on this BARLOW family or knows of someone that does, please let me know.

Joseph Burleson BARLOW was born in September 1858 in Alabama. He was married on 23 December 1876 to Sarah Ann HINTON in Newton County, Texas. Around 1886, they moved to Shelby County, Texas, and settled in Shelbyville. I have records stating he was inducted into the masonic order on 15 August 1893, served as an officer during 1894 and then was expelled on 5 October 1896 for unspecified reasons. The census records for Shelby County in the years 1900, 1910 and 1920, all point to him being born to Georgia natives. Joseph died on 14 July 1920 in Shelby County and Sarah died on 14 November 1927 in Shelby County one day before her 71st birthday. They are both buried in the Shelbyville Cemetery. I have lots of information on the HINTON family. Sarah was born in Atlanta, Georgia, and was a daughter of Mansfield Hinton and Elizabeth White. Most of Sarah's siblings were still alive when she died and are listed in her newspaper obituary from Shelbyville. iv. Thomas Barlow was probably born in Pennsylvania. He was a carpenter and a loyalist, and he and Joseph Barlow, who was probably his brother, were evacuated from New York City on

the ship *William* in 1783, at the end of the Revolutionary War. He and his family of five went to Shelburne, Nova Scotia. Later that year Thomas Barlow was at Saint John where he received a grant of a city lot.

v. Grace Barlow married Joseph Shelton who was a Captain in the Royal Navy.

Henry Barlow, enlisted Apr 23 1861 at New York NY for 2 years, age 20, Private, Co C 4th NY Infantry "Scott Life Guard", organized May 1861 at New York City, deserted Sep 21 1861 at Havre de Grace MD.

Henry Barlow, Private, Co H 67th NY Infantry "1st Long Island", organized Jun 24 1861 at Brooklyn NY, consolidated Sep 1 1864 with

the 65th NY Infantry, mustered out Jul 17 1865.

Henry C. Barlow, Private, Co G 71st NY Militia Infantry, organized May 12 1862 for 3 months, mustered out Sep 2 1862, pension application no. 1220505 filed Mar 4 1899, certificate no. 980728, resident NY, this pension was canceled indicating that he probably died, widow Lucy J. Barlow's pension application no. 696452 filed Apr 14 1899, certificate no. 485875, resident NY.

Henry Barlow, Private, Co C 3rd RI Heavy Artillery, organized Dec 19 1861 from 3rd RI Infantry at Hilton Head SC, mustered out Jun 9 1865, widow Jennie Barlow's pension application no. 380825 filed Sep 24 1888, certificate no. 260727, resident Walpole MA [C1890].

Henry Barlow, Private, Co F 17th IN Infantry, organized Jun 12 1861 at Indianapolis IN, mustered out Aug 8 1865, widow Margaret Barlow's pension application no. 287548 filed Nov 12 1881, certificate no. 204695.

Henry C. Barlow, Corporal, Co H & M 16th IL Cavalry, organized Jan-Apr 1863 at Camp Butler IL, demoted to Private, transferred to Co H 95th IL Infantry (as Henry A. Barlow), Co H 47th IL Infantry, mustered out Jan 21 1866, pension application no. 197892 filed Dec 3 1874, certificate no. 255941, resident IL.

Henry C. Barlow, Private, Battery M 2nd IL Light Artillery, organized Jun 6 1862 at Chicago IL, battery broken up Apr 11 1864.

Henry Barlow, Prescott WI, enlisted Sep 21 1861, Private, Co A 12th WI Infantry, organized Oct-Dec 1861 at
