Smith H. Barlow of Sandy Creek, New York

Smith Henry Barlow was born on October 1, 1832, in Massachusetts, probably at Sheffield, Berkshire County, which was his mother's home-town. He was a son of Smith Husted Barlow and Angelina Loring, and a fourth generation descendant of Moses Barlow of Dutchess County, New York (Smith Henry⁴, Smith Husted³, Smith², Moses¹). It is suspected that Moses Barlow, and thus Smith H. Barlow, was a descendant of John Barlow of Fairfield, Connecticut, but the connection has not yet been firmly established [see *Barlow of Barlow*, page 359, February 1999].

Smith H. Barlow died on Monday evening, March 18, 1901, at his home on Railroad Street in Lacona, a village in the town of Sandy Creek, Oswego County, New York. He had suffered a



stroke on Sunday morning and never recovered. Funeral services were conducted at his home by the Rev. C. L. Peck and he was buried in the Woodlawn Cemetery at Sandy Creek.

Smith H. Barlow was recorded at Northeast, Dutchess County, New York, in the 1850 census and he was a student boarding at 321 State Street, Albany, New York, in 1858 [*Albany (New York) City Directory*]. He moved to Sandy Creek, Oswego County, New York, around 1858 and was recorded there in the 1860 census. He was a carpenter and a school teacher when he was young, and was on the board of trustees which organized the school system at Sandy Creek. He was a Clerk of the Board of Education at Sandy Creek in 1871 and 1872 [*Oswego*

Daily Palladium May 22, 1871], was reelected to the board in 1888, was president in 1892-94, and continued to serve on the board until his death.

In 1862 Smith H. Barlow, with Andrew C. Skinkle as partner, built a sash and door factory on the northeast corner of Academy Street and Harwood Drive. He operated this factory until spring 1870 when he sold his interest and returned to carpentry and contracting. During this period he supervised the construction of the Union Free School in Sandy Creek and also served as an early member of the high school faculty. In 1878 he again started another sash and door factory, on the same property as the first one - the first mill had burned in February 1872 and the building had been rebuilt.

Fire again destroyed the factory in the 1880's and again it was rebuilt. Smith H. Barlow operated this factory until his death in 1901. His son Walter continued the business as W. A. Barlow Co. until about 1919 when it was purchased by Fred Montanye. Under the subsequent management of Tad W. Harding, the business grew into Sancona Builder's Supply until a fire in 1945 again leveled the building. Although the business was continued elsewhere, the site at Academy and Harwood today remains a ruins with trees and brush growing among the foundation walls.

According to his obituary, Smith H. Barlow was an ardent temperance worker and a voter of the Prohibition ticket. He was a liberal supporter of the churches of the village and of all local benevolent and charitable work. He had been for many years a trustee of the Methodist Episcopal Church.

Smith H. Barlow married first Mrs. Martha Pruyne Ferguson, a daughter of Abraham Francis and Sophie (Minott) Pruyne, and widow of Mr. Ferguson. She was born on February 8, 1835, she died on April 23, 1874, at Sandy Creek and she was buried in the Woodlawn Cemetery at Sandy Creek. They had no children.

Smith H. Barlow married second Deborah A. Chapin on October 26, 1875, at Sandy Creek.

She was born on June 18, 1843, at Carthage, Jefferson County, New York, and was a daughter of Harvey E. and Deborah (Fenton) Chapin of Lacona. She died on December 20, 1918, and was buried in the Woodlawn Cemetery. Smith and Deborah adopted one child:

i. Walter A. Barlow was born on November 20, 1863.

Walter A. Barlow was born on November 20, 1863, at Lacona, Oswego County, New York, and was the adopted son of Smith H. and Deborah A. (Chapin) Barlow. He was a resident at Lacona, was educated there and was subsequently associated with his father in the family woodworking business. After his father's death in 1901, Walter continued the business as W. A. Barlow Co. until about 1919 when it was purchased by Fred Montanye and Walter moved to California.

Walter A. Barlow died on May 22, 1931, at Oakland, Alameda County, California. Funeral services were conducted by the Masonic fraternity of Oakland and the remains were cremated.

Walter A. Barlow married Carrie A. Scofield on November 1, 1893, at the home of Luther Fowler at Mt. Kisco, New York. She was born on September 1, 1832, at Madison, Wisconsin, and was a daughter of Owen G. and Carrie (Fenton) Scofield of West Virginia and a cousin of her husband's mother. She died on September 5, 1922, in the Paradise Valley Sanitarium, National City, San Diego County, California. Their child was:

i. Ruth Barlow. A Ruth Barlow Franck (1896-1945) and her husband Robert Philip Franck (1881-) are buried in the Woodlawn Cemetery but it is not definitely known whether this was Walter's daughter. In her mother's obituary of 1922 and in her father's obituary in 1931, Ruth Barlow was given as living in California.

William Barlow married Sarah Bennett at the Cathedral in Manchester in 1863. Both were born in the Malpas, Cheshire area. They moved to Shropshire and began farming in the Wenlock, Rushbury, Cardington area. Their marriage certificate had William age 35 and Sarah age 30. William's father was a farmer named John and Sarah's father was a farmer named Joseph. As I look in the IGI records, I find a lot of Barlows being married in the Cathedral of Manchester. I came across a *Genealogy of the Barlow Family* by J.W. Barlow at the Kentucky History Center in Frankfort. It tells of Sir Thomas Barlow [b. c 1630] of West End Estate, London, member of Parliament and a founder of the Royal Society. Following is his son, Thomas [b. c 1660] who joins Lord Clarendon in settling in Virginia, about 1695 or after King William's War 1689-1697 under the "Grand Model." Thomas had a son Henry [b. 1726 in Caroline Co., VA], who married Judith Livingston [b. c 1720] in 1747 [1756?] and their children were born between 1757-1767. My ancestor Elizabeth, b. c 1762, married John Land about 1781 in Virginia and died after giving birth to daughter Elizabeth [Betsy] Land on 1 Jan. 1796 in Madison Co., KY. Elizabeth's family [siblings] settled in Scott Co., KY and Wilkes Co., NC. I also have Henry's father Thomas as b. 1695 England and d. 1778 Virginia.

The Thomas story has a few flaws, the least of which is an evident missing generation. The Thomas [b. 1660] does not fit as Henry's father. I believe the immigrant Thomas to be Sir Thomas's grandson, which means there is another Thomas in between. The info on Judith having children from age 37-47 sounds iffy as well, possible but iffy.

I have hit a brick wall and can't seem to find the parents of Joseph Barlow (1822 - 12/5/1873) who married Rhoda Ann Slater (1831 - b. Sullivan Co., NY). From census info Joseph was born in PA. He was a lumberman and lived in PA and NY. All his children were born in NY. I have him listed in the 1850 census at Damascus Twp., Wayne Co., PA; 1855 census at Tusten, Sullivan Co., NY; 1860 census at Forestburgh, Sullivan Co., NY; and 1870 census at South Canaan, Wayne Co., PA. Children of Joseph and Rhoda Ann Slater were: Arthur B. Barlow (10/28/1848 - 2/26/1931) married Lydia Ann Talmadge, Catherine Barlow (b 1852), Howell/Norvell Barlow (b 1854), Nathan Barlow (b 1855), Emeline Barlow (b 1856), Albert Barlow (1858 - 9/29/1880) married Eliza Carpenter, Mary Barlow (5/1860 - 4/1883) married Edward Carpenter, Edgar Barlow (1864 - 8/25/1884) married Emma E.
