Richard Barlow of Canada

The following information is primarily obtained from a collection of papers by Samuel Atherton, a descendent of this Barlow line. This collection is located in the Hackley Public Library, 316 West Webster Street, Muskegon, Michigan. The information from this collection is supplemented and/or corroborated by information from other sources, which are indicated by notations in brackets.

First Generation

1. **Richard Barlow**, a native of Yorkshire, England, came to Canada in 1758 with the English troops under General James Wolfe. He was wounded at the taking of Quebec and recuperated in a military hospital in New Brunswick. He was subsequently discharged and was granted a tract of land on the Oromocto River below Fredericton, New Brunswick.

Richard Barlow married Miss N. Phillips, probably Abigail (Nabby) Phillips. She was of United Empire Loyalist stock and

they had two children, probably born at Fredericton, New Brunswick:

- i. George Barlow was born around 1765. He went to sea and never returned.
- ii. William Barlow was born in 1767.

Second Generation

2. **William Barlow** was born in 1767 probably at his parent's home near Fredericton, New Brunswick. He died on May 5, 1847, on his farm at Binbrook, Hamilton-Wentworth, Ontario, and was buried in the Barlow Cemetery, a private family cemetery on his property at Binbrook.

William Barlow married Mary Bedell. She was born on February 7, 1776, to a United Empire Loyalist family which had come from Staten Island, New York. She died on October 12, 1854, and was buried in the Barlow Cemetery at Binbrook.

William and Mary (Bedell) Barlow had nine children, all born in New Brunswick:

i. Susan Barlow was born on July 21, 1799. She married Joseph Arnold in August 1814. He was born on January 1, 1792, and died on July 6, 1856. He was a farmer and they lived at Walsingham, Haldimand-Norfolk, Ontario. She died on November 26, 1876.

ii. Betsey Barlow was born in 1800. She married John Arnold. He was born in 1797 in New Brunswick and died in 1879. They lived at Townsend, near Harford, county Norfolk, Ontario, where he was recorded as a farmer in the 1871 census. She died in 1868.

3. iii. James Barlow was born in 1803.

iv. Phoebe Barlow was born in 1805 at Wakefield, New Brunswick [IGI]. She married Jesse Churchill in 1824 at Wakefield [IGI] and they lived near Paris, county Brant, Ontario. She died in 1828.

v. Mary Barlow was born on July 6, 1806. She married William Smith on November 13, 1825, in New Brunswick. He was born on March 6, 1801, in New Brunswick and he died on September 30, 1880, at Rockford, Ontario. They came from New Brunswick to Stoney Creek, Ontario, around 1837. He was recorded as a farmer at Townsend, Ontario, in the 1871 census.

4. vi. Richard Barlow was born in 1811.

5. vii. Stephen Barlow was born on August 2, 1815.

6. viii. William Barlow was born on March 31, 1817.

ix. Catherine J. Barlow was born on July 14, 1818. She married David Shaw on April 26, 1836. He was born either on April 26, 1807, or on April 23, 1809. They lived at Binbrook, Ontario,

and they had six children. She died on November 1, 1852, and he died on July 18, 1854, both at Binbrook.

Third Generation

3. James Barlow was born in 1803 near Fredericton, New Brunswick, and was a son of William and Mary (Bedell) Barlow. He settled in county Wentworth, Ontario, in 1827 and moved to Walpole township, near Hagersville, Springvale, in 1842. He was the first white settler in that community and slept under his wagon until he could erect a house. He died in 1890 probably at his home near Springvale and was buried there.

James Barlow married Susan Turtelot. She was born in Maine and died about 1866. They had four children:

i. George Barlow was born on June 11, 1834, and died in July 1897 or 1898.

ii. Nancy Barlow married James Husband.

iii. Sarah Barlow married Joseph Husband.

iv. Amanda Barlow married Marshall Bartram.

4. Richard Barlow was born in 1811 near Fredericton, New Brunswick, and was a son of William and Mary (Bedell) Barlow. He was a farmer and was recorded in county Wentworth in the 1827 and 1875 directories. He was recorded at Binbrook, Ontario, in the 1871 census. He died on April 10, 1902, at Binbrook and was buried there in the Baptist Cemetery.

Richard Barlow married Rebecca McCrimmon on September 17, 1837. She was born in 1817 and was a daughter of John (1786-1877) and Ann (Grooms) McCrimmon, who were married in 1817. John McCrimmon was a son of Donald Daniel McCrimmon (1745-1831), a Loyalist, and Elizabeth (Klein) McCrimmon (1747-1789). Rebecca (McCrimmon) Barlow died on January 3, 1905, at Binbrook and was buried there in the Baptist Cemetery. They had five children:

i. Almira Barlow was born on July 27, 1839, and died on March 24, 1935.

ii. Victoria Barlow was born on May 26, 1842. She did not marry. She died on May 21, 1924, at Binbrook and was buried there in the Baptist Cemetery.

iii. Henry Barlow was born on January 17, 1845. He was recorded as a farmer at Binbrook in the 1871 census. He died on November 2, 1926.

iv. Adoniram Judson Barlow was born on June 29, 1851. He married Evangeline Revell and he operated his father's farm at Binbrook after his father died. He died on October 31, 1923.

v. Hasseltine (or Anhasilton) Barlow was born on February 18, 1855, and died on August 10, 1896.

5. Stephen Barlow was born on August 2, 1815, near Fredericton, New Brunswick, and was a son of William and Mary (Bedell) Barlow. He died on November 11, 1862, at Binbrook, Ontario, during a typhoid epidemic and was buried in the Barlow Cemetery at Binbrook.

Stephen Barlow married first Obedience Cook on October 6, 1839, at Binbrook, Ontario. She was born on May 11, 1820, and was a daughter of James and Sarah

(Waldron) Cook. She died on October 26, 1858, at Binbrook and was buried there in the Barlow Cemetery. They had eleven children:

i. Charles Barlow was born on August 1, 1840, and died on May 24, 1908.

ii. Sarah Barlow was born on November 24, 1841, and died on January 10, 1921.

iii. William Albert Barlow was born on May 24, 1843. He was recorded as a carpenter at Binbrook in the 1871 census. He died on October 12, 1882.

iv. Mary Amelia Barlow was born on April 6, 1845. She did not marry. She died on November 24, 1862, of typhoid during the same epidemic that claimed her father.

v. Martha Jane Barlow was born on April 6, 1845. She died on December 18, 1845. She was the first burial in the private cemetery near her parent's house and she also has a monument in the Binbrook Methodist Cemetery.

vi. James Francis Barlow was born on April 1, 1847, and died on October 15, 1915.

vii. Lucy Melinda Barlow was born on January 18, 1849, and died on October 17, 1934.

viii. Richard Baxter Barlow was born on December 26, 1850, and died on February 16, 1942.

ix. Florilla Adelaide Barlow was born on February 1, 1853, and died on November 17, 1930.

x. Abiather (Bice) Barlow was born on September 18, 1854, and died on August 28, 1936.

xi. Jemima Barlow was born on March 26, 1856, and died on February 3, 1946.

Stephen Barlow married second Eliza Robbins, a widow, on December 25, 1860.

6. William Barlow was born on March 31, 1817, near Fredericton, New Brunswick, and was a son of William and Mary (Bedell) Barlow. He settled at Binbrook, Ontario, on 100 acres that was given to him by his father. He was recorded in county Wentworth in 1832, 1850 and 1860. He died on August 17, 1864, at Binbrook and was buried there in the Baptist Cemetery.

William Barlow married first Hannah McCrimmon. She was a sister of Rebecca, his brother Richard's wife, and a daughter of John and Ann (Grooms) McCrimmon. [The Tweedsmuir History by Richard Barlow says that he married first Hannah Jackson.] She died on July 4, 1841, at Binbrook. Their children were:

i. Mary Ann Barlow married Henry Bird. She died on January 10, 1908.

ii. Rebecca Barlow possibly married a Mr. Pither and they had no children. She died about 1928 at Hamilton, Ontario.

William Barlow married second Emaline Currie of Glanford, Ontario, on November 18, 1845. They were married by the Rev. Joseph Clutton in the Baptist Church at Dundas, Ontario, and the ceremony was witnessed by Richard and Stephen Barlow. She was born on September 13, 1820, and was recorded at Binbrook in the 1871 census. She died on August 5, 1900, at Hamilton, Ontario. Their children were:

iii. Margaret Anne Barlow was born on August 13, 1847, and died on March 20, 1932.

iv. Eliza Jane Barlow was born on July 13, 1849, and died on December 12, 1943.

v. Ira Hamilton Barlow was born on December 13, 1853. He was recorded in county Wentworth in the 1875 directory. He died on February 14, 1934.

vi. Phoebe Barlow was born in December 1854 and died in infancy.

vii. Stephen Barlow was born on May 17, 1856, and died in infancy.

Joseph BARLOW was born in 1817 in Virginia and he married Sarah ROBINSON in Washington County, Virginia. She was born in 1818 and was a daughter of Mitchell and Rachel Edmiston ROBINSON. Joseph and Sarah died around 1868-70 in McDonough County, Illinois. Was Joseph's father also named Joseph? His mother was Rachel THOMAS who was born in Tennessee. Can this BARLOW line be traced through Tennessee and back to Pennsylvania? Can anyone help? I have a little information on the family and am willing to share.

Sarilda/Ceralda C. BARLOW was born about 1837 in New York and her parents were born in Vermont, both according to census information. She married Alonzo Pennial BACON before 1860 probably in either Wisconsin, Illinois or Nebraska. I haven't been able to trace the family after the 1880 Kansas census. There is a slight possibility that BARLOW might have been her married name, and the surname BURTON might be involved somewhere because of its subsequent use in the family. Any information on her parentage and ancestry would be greatly appreciated.

Aaron Barlow, Louisiana Territorial Militia, and Cornstalk Militia of Kentucky, married Sarah Kilcrease, died in August 1840 (or 1844) in Baldwin County, Alabama.

Abner Barlow, Private, 32nd Regiment (Krickbaum's), Pennsylvania Militia.

Abraham Barlow, Private, Russell's Battalion, Ohio Militia.

Abraham Barlow, Private, 1st Regiment (Williamson's), Ohio Militia.

Abraham Barlow, Private, Captain John Chonner's Company, Ohio Militia, served from July 31 to August 14, 1813.

Abraham Barlow, Private, Captain Samuel Dunnavan's Company, Ohio Militia, served from Jul 13 to September 5, 1813.

Abraham Barlow, Licking County, Ohio, Private, Captain James Rightmire's Company, Ohio Militia, served from May 4 to May 19, 1813, and from September 8, 1814, to March 5, 1815.

Alvin Barlow, Private, 16th Regiment (Porter's), Kentucky Militia (see also John Camron and Hugh McNeale).

Anson Barlow, musician, Captain J. M. Sinclair's Company, 4th Regiment Lt. Col. J. Comming's), Massachusetts Militia, raised in Waldo County (Montville, Freedom and vicinity), Maine, served from September 3 to September 20, 1814, at Belfast, Waldo County, Maine.

Arnold Barlow, Delaware Flotilla, enlisted August 1, 1812, discharged February 3, 1815, pensioner (W.O. 86, W.C. 74, bounty land 3330-160-55).

Benjamin Barlow, Sergeant, 29th Regiment (Ballard's), Virginia Militia.

Benjamin Barlow, Private, 29th Regiment (Boykin's), Virginia Militia.

Benjamin Barlow Jr., Private, later Corporal, 164th Regiment (Churchill's), New York Militia.

Benjamin Barlow, Private, Kearney's 13th Infantry Regiment, received patent dated September 2, 1818, for bounty land in Illinois, warrant no. 4492, for the northeast 1/4 of Section 12 of T6N R8W, Hancock County, patent delivered September 15, 1818, to Benjamin Barlow of Canandaigua, New York.

Charles Barlow, Delaware County, New York, son of Samuel and Ann (Hawley) Barlow, Private, Captain David S. Denio's Company, Farrington's Regiment, New York Militia, enlisted September 8, 1814, discharged December 10, 1814, pensioner (S.O. 4591, S.C. 2286, bounty land 52159-40-50 and 22545-120-55).

Christopher Barlow, Private, 13th Regiment (Gray's), Kentucky Militia.

Cornelius Barlow, Private, Captain D. Collin's Company, Lt. Col. S. K. Chamberlain's Regiment, Massachusetts Militia, raised at Lenox, Massachusetts, and vicinity, served September 10 to October 30, 1814, at Boston, Massachusetts.

Cornelius Berlew, or Cornelius Burlew, Captain Moses Cannon's Company, Pennsylvania Militia, married April 10, 1814, in Centre or Huntington County, Pennsylvania, resident Mifflin County, Pennsylvania, he died July 26, 1868, at Lewistown, Pennsylvania, widow

Mary (Miller) Berlew received pension (W.C. 5807), she died July 26, 1868.

Edward Barlow, Seaman, Captain Ingersoll's Command, Sea Fencibles, New York.

Edwin Barlow, Private, Captain Josiah Ingersoll's Company, New York Militia, enlisted September 27, 1814, discharged December 29, 1814, pensioner (S.O. 21726, S.C. 14488, bounty land 33875-160-55).

Eli Barlow, Private, 2nd Regiment (Schucht's), Maryland Militia.

Elisha Barlow, Fifer, Lieutenant Carter's Company, Captain Samuel Gilbert's Company, Connecticut Militia, pensioner (W.O. 11493).

Elisha Barlow, Ensign, Heermance's Brigade, New York Militia.

Elisha C. Barlow, Ensign, 1st Regiment (Belknap's), New York Militia.

Elisha Barlow, resident at Bath, Greene County, Ohio, in 1835.

Elnathan Barlow, Sergeant, 1st Regiment (DeLong's), Ohio Militia, killed January 14, 1815, at Detroit, Michigan, widow Ann Warman received pension (file no. 11712).

George Barlow, Corporal, Captain Amasa Parker's Company, 13th Regiment (Farrington's), New York Militia, enlisted August 24, 1812, stationed at Sackets Harbor, New York, discharged March 4, 1813, pensioner (W.O. 19426, W.C. 12383, bounty land 42983-80-50 and 25151-80-55).

George Barlow, Corporal, 60th Regiment (Minor's), Virginia Militia.

Hartecy Barlow, Private, Johnson's Regiment, Mounted, Kentucky Volunteers.

Hartecy Barlow, Private, Johnson's Regiment, Mounted, Kentucky Volunteers.

Hastings Barlow, Private, Dudley's Mounted Battalion, Kentucky Volunteers.

Henry Barlow, Private, 3rd Artillery & Light Infantry Regiment, New York Militia.

Henson Barlow, Private, Allyn's 7th Infantry Regiment, received patent dated January 3, 1818, for bounty land in Illinois, warrant no. 1813, for southwestern 1/4 of Section 29 of T3N R2W, Schuyler County, patent delivered January 20, 1818, to Hon. W. G. Blount.

Hiram P. Barlow, Sergeant, Captain J. Case's Company, Benedict's Regiment, New York Militia, enlisted September 2, 1812, discharged January 10, 1813, "served as substitute for Isaac Johnson," pensioner (W.O. 15682, W.C. 9412, bounty land 22483-80-5- and 37810-80-55).

J. Barlow, 40th Infantry Regiment, his heir E. H. Barlow received patent dated February 25, 1818, for bounty land in Illinois, warrant no. 8496, for the southwest 1/4 of Section 3 of T8S R4W, Calhoun County, patent delivered on March 12, 1818, to Hon. E. H. Mills.

Jacob Barlow, Private, 5th Regiment, Virginia Militia.

James Barlow, Seaman, ship *Saratoga*, wounded September 11, 1814, in the engagement with the British fleet on Lake Champlain.

James Barlow, Private, Captain John M. Sinclair's Company, Massachusetts Militia, enlisted September 3, 1814, discharged September 20, 1814, pensioner (S.O. 24798, S.C. 23707, bounty land 81408-160-55).

James Barlow, Private, Austin's Regiment, South Carolina Militia.

James Barlow, Private, 36th Regiment (Jessop's), Maryland Militia.

James H. Barlow, Sergeant, 13th Regiment (Farrington's), New York Militia.

Jesse Barlow, Private, Farrington's Regiment, New York Militia.

Jesse Barlow, Private, 4th Regiment (Pogue's), Kentucky Volunteers (originally filed under John Right).

Jesse Barlow, Private, 10th Regiment (Boswell's), Kentucky Militia.

Jesse Barlow, Second Lieutenant, 2nd Regiment Artillery (Colonel Samuel Hawkin's), U.S. Volunteers from New York.

Jesse Barlow, Second Lieutenant, 2nd New York Volunteers, February 16, 1813, to April 1814; First Lieutenant, 46th U.S. Infantry Regiment, April 21, 1814; discharged June 15, 1815. "Jesse Barlow was a tall, very erect man, with dark hair and eyes. He enlisted in the War of 1812, and was promoted through the varying grades until in 1814, when he was made First Lieutenant in the 46th Regiment of Infantry. His commission was signed by President Madison and Secretary of War James Monroe. His term of service was passed on Staten Island. Later he became a Captain.

Job Burlew, Richard W. Cheeseman's New Jersey Militia, married Amy Gilford on March 1, 1866, at Waymus Furnace, Utah, resident Utah County and Juab County, Utah, pensioner (S.C. 18937).

Colonel W. Edward's Regiment, Massachusetts Militia, raised at Northampton, Massachusetts, served from September 8 to November 5, 1814, at Boston.

John Barlow, Private, Captain David S. Denio's Company, Farrington's Regiment, New York Militia, enlisted September 8, 1814, discharged December 13, 1814, pensioner (W.O. 1363, W.C. 231, bounty land 13784-40-50 and 39050-120-55).
