Moses Barlow of Dutchess and Broome Counties, New York

1. **Moses Barlow** was born on April 19, 1750, at Norwalk, Fairfield County, Connecticut. He died on November 6, 1835, at age 87 years 1 month 3 days, at Chenango, Broome County, New York, and was buried there.

Moses Barlow lived at Amenia, Dutchess County, New York, and enlisted there in the Militia, according to his Revolutionary War Pension Records. He served as a Private in the 6th Dutchess County Militia. He was discharged at Fishkill, Dutchess County, New York, and lived at Amenia until he moved to Chenango in 1812.

Moses Barlow and his children were recorded as leasing farm no. 1, lot 47, on October 2, 1797, in the *Little Nine Partners Rent Book*. Subsequently the Rent Book says that Moses Barlow Jr. sold his part of farm no. 1 to Weaver for \$900.

Moses Barlow, according to the *History of Pine Plains* by Isaac Hunting,

lived in the old Young-Stewart Hotel, about a mile and a half northwest of the village, and later on Church Street, east of the corners. Later still in 1805 the family moved to the Ten Eyck farm, south of C. C. More, succeeding Friend Sheldon in the Ten Eyck dwelling. Moses was a "pettifogger" in a justice court. His first wife was a sister to Thomas Braman, who lived a mile east of Sackett corners south of Attlebury station, and thus she would have been either Elizabeth, Anna or Esther.

Isaac Hunting's book says further that the Barlow children who attended the Pine Plains school in 1799 were Amy, Morris, Tamma and Walter. The Barlow children in the 1799-1800 term were Amy, Morris, Moses, Stephen, Tamma and Walter.

Thomas Braman, who was on the 1760 Crum Elbow, Dutchess County, tax list, died on June 28, 1809. His will of October 2, 1805, was probated on August 18, 1809, and named brother John Braman,

nephew Cyrus Braman, Braman Barlow ("who resides with me"), Braman Barlow's oldest son James Barlow and James' brother Cyrus Barlow, second son of Braman. No wife or children of Thomas Braman were named in his will.

Moses' children by his first wife were [*History of Pine Plains*]:

2. i. Braman Barlow was born on May 19, 1774, at Stanford, Dutchess County, New York.

3. ii. Smith Barlow was born in 1781.

4. iii. Moses Barlow Jr.

5. iv. Morris Barlow was born on March 9, 1790, in Dutchess County, New York [calculated, 1850 census].

6. v. Jacob Barlow.

7. vi. James Barlow was born around 1796-8 in Dutchess County [1850,'55,'60 censuses].

8. vii. Stephen Barlow. There was a Stephen Barlow born in 1777 living in Orleans County, New York, in the 1850 census.

9. viii. Walter Barlow was born on November 19, 1790.

ix. Cynthia Barlow married first Dr. Asahel Haskins, a physician at Pine Plains, and at one time owner of about 3 acres including the Ketterer Hotel corner. Not long after her marriage, Dr. Haskins died and Cynthia married second Daniel Smith, a son of Peter and Sarah (Winans) Smith. Daniel Smith died leaving a daughter who later married Morris Thompson, a son of Caleb Thompson at the Square. He kept the "Brick Tavern," later the Tripp farmhouse, at

the Square. Not long after, Morris Thompson, his wife and her mother, Cynthia (Barlow) Smith, died of fever nearly at the same time [*History of Pine Plains*].

x. Amy Barlow.

xi. Betsey Barlow.

xii. Tamma Barlow.

Morris Barlow, son of Moses, said that his father lost his first wife in 1810 and married second Sarah Draper in August 1812 in Dutchess County. She was born in 1772 in New York [1850 census] and was recorded at Conklin, Broome County, New York, in the 1850 census. Friend Barlow, the only child of Moses and Sarah, age 38, made a declaration dated March 24, 1853.

Moses and Sarah (Draper) Barlow's child was:

10. xiii. Friend Barlow was born in 1812 [1850 census] or 1815 [1860 census, declaration March 24, 1853] in New York.

Second Generation

2. Braman Barlow was born on May 19, 1774, at Stanford, Dutchess County, New York, and was a son of 1. Moses Barlow and his first wife. He was a farmer and he was recorded at Stanford in the 1810 through 1840 censuses. He died on August 7, 1845, at Stanford and was buried there in the Attlebury Cemetery.

Braman Barlow married Mary Ingersoll probably around 1795 and probably at Stanford. She was born on April 23, 1773, and was a daughter of James and Mary (Hoyt) Ingersoll [*Ingersoll Genealogy*].

Barlow and Allied Families Reprinted

At long last, the *Barlow and Allied Families* book by Laura Campbell Hawkins and Emma Campbell DeVries has been reprinted. This very rare book, originally published in 1930 and never reprinted, covers many of the descendants of the infamous George Barlow (c. 1620 -1684) of Sandwich, Massachusetts, and includes a large amount of historical information on this family in New England and on George's presumed ancestry in England.

So far as can be determined, only seven original copies of this book exist and they are held by the Library of Congress, the Newberry Library, the Connecticut State Library, the New York (City) Public Library, the Minnesota Historical Society, the Kansas City Public Library and the Historical Society of Pennsylvania. The book has been microfilmed and many libraries have these copies. Because the original is so rare and has not been available to photocopy, this book has been reproduced from a microfilm copy and transcribed to a computer using a scanner and optical character recognition software.

Both the original and the reprint are 8½" x 11", 3 leaves, 217+ pages and fully indexed. Two versions of the reprint are offered: a soft-cover non-archival version and a hard-cover archival (acid-free) version. The soft-cover is immediately available for \$44.50 and the hard-cover will be available in mid-April for \$49.50; both postpaid to U.S. addresses.

She died on September 27, 1848, at Stanford and was buried there in the Attlebury Cemetery. Their children were probably all born at Stanford:

i. James Barlow was born around 1794-1800 [1810 census]. He did not marry, he had no children and he died in 1817.

ii. Maria Barlow was born around 1794-1800 [1810 census]. She married James H. Germond/Germain on December 25, 1822, at Stanford [Dutchess County Historical Society records] and they had nine children: Edward, Talmadge, Cyrus (married Viola Hicks), Mary, Sarah, Elizabeth, Frances (married William Creede), Nettie (married Robert Halstead) and Julia (married Isaac Winance).

11. iii. Cyrus B. Barlow was born on April 30, 1803 [gravestone; 1850, '60 censuses]. He married Minerva Welling. She was born in 1808 in New York [1860 census]. He died on April 18, 1881, at Stanford.

12. iv. Myron H. Barlow was born on July 30, 1806, at Stanford. He married Catharine J. ----- . He died on May 27, 1881, at Union Vale, Dutchess County.

3. Smith Barlow was born in 1781 and the *Little Nine Partners Rent Book* says that he was a son of 1. Moses Barlow. He leased farm no. 2, lot 47, on October 2, 1797 [Rent Book], and was recorded at Northeast,

Dutchess County, in the 1800 census. He died by the accidental discharge of a cannon on the 4th of July.

Smith Barlow married Susannah Husted. She was born on June 12, 1784, and was a daughter of Peter and Polly (Smith) Husted of Dutchess County. After Smith's death she married second Seth Harris on February 19, 1807. He was born around 1763 probably at Amenia and was a son of Joseph Harris. He had married first Isabella Gamble. He died on February 2, 1842, at Pine Plains and Susan died on October 19, 1828, at Pine Plains. Smith Barlow's only child was:

13. i. Smith Husted Barlow was born in 1803 possibly in Massachusetts. He married Angelina Loring on April 11, 1827. He died on May 7, 1847.

4. **Moses Barlow Jr.**, was a son of 1. Moses Barlow and his first wife. He was recorded at Northeast, Dutchess County, in the 1810 census.

5. **Morris Barlow** was born on March 9, 1790, in Dutchess County, New York [calculated; 1850,'55 censuses], and was a son of 1. Moses Barlow and his first wife. He was a farmer and was recorded at Conklin, Broome County, New York, in the 1820 through 1860 censuses. He died on January 17, 1875, at age 84 years 10 months 8 days at Union, Broome County, New York [obituary in "Broome Republican" *Gleanings from Early Broome County Newspapers* by Mautrice R. Hitt, Jr.].

Morris Barlow married Sally Stickle on February 13, 1811, in Dutchess County [Dutchess County Historical Society records]. She was born in 1789 probably in Dutchess County [1850 census]. She died

between 1850 and 1855 probably at Conklin [1850,'55 censuses]. Their children were:

i. Mariah Barlow was born on June 9, 1814, in Dutchess County, New York. She died on September 9, 1896, at Conklin, Broome County, New York [vital records], and was buried there in the Shawsville Cemetery. She married Washington Layton in 1833. He was born on February 8, 1802, in New Jersey. He died on August 8, 1887, and was buried in the Shawsville Cemetery. Their children were: William Layton, born in 1833; George Layton, born about 1835; Byron Layton, born about 1838; Henry Smith Layton, born in 1839; Morris B. Layton, born on September 15, 1840; Robert E. Layton, born about 1843; John H. Layton, born about 1845; Mary Ann Layton, born about 1847; Juliette Layton, born about 1848; and Virgil Layton, born in May 1850 [correspondence Darcie Randall Ridolfi May 3, 1996].

14. ii. Walker Barlow was born in 1816 in Dutchess County, New York [1860 census].

15. iii. Nathan Barlow (probably) was born in 1818 in New York [1850 census].

16. iv. Morris Barlow Jr. was born in 1821 in New York [1850,'60 censuses]. He was a farmer and was recorded at Conklin, Broome County, New York, in the 1850 census. He married Nancy -----. She was born in 1820 in Pennsylvania [1850, '60 censuses].

17. v. Morgan Barlow was born in 1821-24 in New York [1860 census]. He was a farmer and was recorded at Conklin in the 1850 and 1860 censuses. He married Nancy -----. She was born in 1827 in New York [1850, '60 censuses].

18. vi. Jacob Barlow was born in 1825-6 in New York [1850, '60 censuses]. He was a farmer and he was recorded at Conklin, Broome County, in the 1850 and 1860 censuses. He married Jane -----. She was born in 1837 in New York [1860 census].

19. vii. Marshall Barlow was born in 1826 [1860 census] or in 1829 [1850 census] or in 1831 [1855 census] in Broome County, New York. He was a farmer and he was recorded at Conklin in the 1850 and 1860 censuses. He served as a Private in the Civil War in Company D of the 109th New York Infantry Regiment. He was killed on May 12, 1864, at Spotsylvania Court House, Virginia.

20. viii. Homer Barlow was born in 1833 [1850, '55 censuses] or in 1834 [1860 census] in Broome County, New York. He was a farmer and was recorded at Conklin in the 1850, 1855 and 1860 censuses. He married Margaret ----- in 1860 [1860 census]. She was born in 1841 in New York [1860 census].

21. ix. George Barlow was born in 1845 [1850 census] or in 1846 [1860 census] in New York. He was recorded at Conklin in the 1850 and 1860 censuses.

x. Hellen E. Barlow, or Ellen Barlow, was born in 1848 [1860 census] or in 1849 [1850 census] in New York. She was recorded at Conklin in the 1850 and 1860 censuses.

22. xi. William H. Barlow was born in 1852 in New York [1860 census].

6. Jacob Barlow was a son of 1. Moses Barlow and his first wife. Nothing further is known about him.

7. James Barlow was born around 1796-8 in Dutchess County, New York [1850, '55, '60 censuses], and was a son of 1. Moses Barlow and his first wife. He was recorded as an innkeeper at Durham, Greene

County, New York, in the 1850 census. He moved to Coxsackie, Greene County, in 1854 and was recorded as a hotelkeeper there in the 1855 census. He was recorded as a farmer at Durham in the 1860 census.

James Barlow married first Sally Malvina Collins on October 8, 1829, in the Reformed Dutch Church at Catskill, Greene County. She was born in 1808 in Connecticut [1850 census] and was a daughter of Silas and Sally Collins. She and James separated and may have subsequently divorced. She was recorded living with her parents at Vernon, Oneida County, New York, in the 1850 census. Their child was:

i. July A. Barlow was born in 1825 in Greene County [1855 census]. She married Samuel Hotchkiss. He was born in 1825 in Greene County [1855 census]. Their child was: Jane Hotchkiss who was born in May 1855 in Greene County [1855 census]. They were recorded living with James and Catharine Barlow at Coxsackie in the 1855 census.

23. ii. James W. Barlow was born in 1830 [1850 census]. He was recorded living with his mother at Vernon in the 1850 census.

24. iii. William C. Barlow was born in 1832 in New York [1850 census]. He was recorded living with his mother at Vernon in the 1850 census.

iv. Caroline Barlow was born in 1832 in New York [1850 census]. She was recorded with her father at Coxsackie in the 1850 census.

v. Rosaltha Barlow was born in 1835 in New York [1850 census]. She was recorded with her father at Coxsackie in the 1850 census.

25. vi. George Barlow was born in 1835 in Greene County [1855 census]. He was a boatman [1855 census]. He married Willmena -----. She was born in 1832 in Germany [1850 census]. Their child was: Louisa Barlow who was born in 1852 in Greene County [1855 census]. They were recorded living with James and Catharine Barlow at Coxsackie in the 1855 census.

26. vii. Adelbert A. Barlow was born in 1834 or 1839 in New York [1850 census]. He was recorded twice in the 1850 census: first with his father at Coxsackie on July 18, 1850, and second with his mother at Vernon, Oneida County, on August 16, 1850.

viii. Sarahett Barlow was born in 1836 in New York [1850 census]. She was recorded with her father at Coxsackie in the 1850 census.

James Barlow married second Catharine -----. She was born in 1800 in Greene County [1850, '55, '60 censuses]. A grandson James Barlow, born in 1850 in Oneida County, New York, was also living with them in the 1855 census.

8. Stephen Barlow was a son of 1. Moses Barlow and his first wife. This may be the Stephen Barlow born in 1777 and living in Orleans County, New York, in the 1850 census.

9. Walter Barlow was born on November 19, 1790, in Dutchess County, New York, and was a son of 1. Moses Barlow and his first wife. He moved to Durham, Greene County, New York, in 1828 and was recorded there as a farmer in the 1830, 1840 and 1850 censuses. He was recorded living with his son Warren at

Durham in the 1855 census. He died on November 16, 1857, at Durham.

Walter Barlow married Lydia Wright around 1820. She was born in 1797 in Greene County [1850, '55 censuses] and was a daughter of George and Elizabeth Wright. George Wright was a first settler on Wright Street in Durham. Elizabeth Wright's will was proved on January 23, 1860. Lydia (Wright) Barlow was recorded living with her son Warren at Durham in the 1855 census and with her daughter Lydia at Durham in the 1860 census. Walter and Lydia Barlow's children were:

27. i. Warren Barlow was born around 1820-22 in Albany County, New York [1850, '55, '60 censuses].

ii. Betsey A. Barlow was born in 1823 probably in Albany County [1850 census].

28. iii. Walter Barlow Jr. was born around 1824-25 in Albany County [1850, '55, '60 censuses].

29. iv. William Barlow was born around 1826-27 in Greene County [1850, '55, '60 censuses].

v. Lydia Barlow was born in 1828 [1855 census] or 1833 [1860 census] in Greene County [1855 census]. She married a Mr. ----- Finch who died between 1853 and 1855 [1855 census]. She was recorded as a widow with her brother Warren and her son Warren at Durham in the 1855 census. Their child Warren Finch was born in 1853 in Greene County [1855 census].

10. Friend Barlow was born in 1812 [1850 census] or 1815 [1860 census, declaration March 24, 1853] in New York and was a son of 1. Moses and Sarah

(Draper) Barlow. He was a farmer and was recorded at Chenango, Broome County, New York, in the 1840 census; at Conklin, Broome County, in the 1850 census; and at Hamilton, Lee County, Illinois, in the 1860 census.

Friend Barlow married Mary A. ----. She was born around 1821-23 in New York [1850, '60 censuses]. Their children were:

i. Sarah Ann Barlow was born in 1845 in New York [1850, '60 censuses].

30. ii. Moses Barlow was born in 1847 in New York [1850, '60 censuses].

iii. Friend Barlow was born in 1850 in New York [1850 census]. He apparently died young because he was not with the family in the 1860 census.

31. iv. Andrew Barlow was born in 1852 in New York [1860 census].

v. Jane Barlow was born in 1855 in Illinois [1860 census].

vi. Mary Barlow was born in 1857 in Illinois [1860 census].

vii. Angeline Barlow was born in 1859 in Illinois [1860 census].

Third Generation

11. Cyrus B. Barlow was born on April 30, 1803 [gravestone; 1850, '60 censuses], probably at Stanford, Dutchess County, New York, and was a son of 2. Braman and Mary (Ingersoll) Barlow. He was recorded at Stanford in the 1830, 1840, 1850 and 1860 censuses. He died on April 18, 1881, and was buried in the Stanfordville Cemetery at Stanford.

Cyrus B. Barlow married Minerva Welling. She was called Maria and was listed as born in 1809 in New York in the 1850 census. She was listed as only M. and born in 1808 in the 1860 census. Their children were probably born at Stanford:

i. Mirun Barlow was born in December 1828. He died on August 20, 1829, at age 9 months and was buried in the Attlebury Cemetery at Stanford.

ii. Myron Barlow married John Crokite.

iii. Caroline Barlow was born in 1831 [1850 census]. She married Benjamin Palmer.

iv. Frances Barlow married a Dr. Thorn.

v. Manand Barlow was born in 1834 [1850 census].

12. Myron H. Barlow was born on July 30, 1806, at Stanford, Dutchess County, New York, and was a son of 2. Braman and Mary (Ingersoll) Barlow. He was recorded at Stanford in the 1840 and 1860 censuses, and as a farmer at Milan, Dutchess County, in the 1850 census. He died on May 27, 1881, at Union Vale, Dutchess County, and was buried there in the Verbank Cemetery.

Myron H. Barlow married first Catharine J. -----. She was born on May 14, 1817. She died on August 29, 1853, at age 36 years 3 months 15 days and was buried in the Bangall (Baptist Church) Cemetery at Stanford. Their children were probably born at Stanford:

i. Isadore E. Barlow was born on November 26, 1839. She was recorded with her father in the 1850 and 1860 censuses.

She married George H. Brownell, who was possibly a son of Joshua and Esther (Denton) Brownell. She died on January 6, 1873, at age 33 years 1 month 11 days and was buried in the Clove Cemetery at Union Vale, Dutchess County.

ii. Alice Barlow was born on August 17, 1844. She was recorded with her father in the 1850 and 1860 censuses. She died on March 23, 1861, at age 16 years 7 months 6 days at Stanford and was buried there in the Bangall (Baptist Church) Cemetery.

iii. Charles R. Barlow was born in 1848 [1850, '60 censuses]. He was recorded with his father in the 1850 and 1860 censuses.

iv. E. Barlow (female) was born in 1850 [1860 census] (see Etta Barlow below).

Myron H. Barlow married second Martha Van Vlack between 1853 and 1860, probably at Stanford. She was born in 1834 [1860 census] at Pleasant Valley, Dutchess County. Their children were probably born at Stanford:

v. Emerson Barlow was born in 1856 [1860 census]. He was recorded with his parents in the 1860 census. He was a dentist. He married Eugenie DuBois and they had one daughter Susie Barlow.

vi. Alfred Barlow was born in 1858 [1860 census]. He was later a stock buyer at Chicago, Illinois.

vii. Myron Barlow was born after 1860. He married Jennie Carpenter.

viii. Jennie Barlow was born after 1860. She was later a teacher.

ix. George Barlow was born after 1860 at Union Vale, Dutchess County. He was later a farmer.

x. Etta Barlow was born at Union Vale, Dutchess County, and she may have been the E. Barlow recorded with her parents in the 1860 census. She was later a teacher.

13. Smith Husted Barlow was born in 1803, possibly in Massachusetts, and was a son of 3. Smith and Susannah (Husted) Barlow. He was recorded at Sheffield, Berkshire County, Massachusetts, in the 1830 and 1840 censuses. He died on May 7, 1847, at age 44 at Salisbury, Litchfield County, Connecticut [*Hartford Courant*], and was buried there in the Bryant Cemetery [Hale index, Connecticut State Library].

Smith Husted Barlow married Angelina Loring on April 11, 1827, at Sheffield, Massachusetts [*International Genealogy Index*]. She died at age 45 in Connecticut. Their children were:

i. Susan H. Barlow was probably the Susan H. Barlow who was born on July 7, 1828, died on April 27, 1914, and was buried in the Riverside Cemetery at Waterbury, Connecticut.

ii. Hannah L. Barlow was perhaps the Hannah L. Barlow who was born in 1830, died in 1903, and was buried in the Forest View Cemetery at Winchester, Connecticut.

iii. Smith H. Barlow was born on October 1, 1832, in Massachusetts and died on March 18, 1901. He was recorded at Northeast, Dutchess County, New York, in the 1850 census and he was a student boarding at 321 State Street, Albany, New York, in 1858 [*Albany City Directory*]. He moved to Sandy Creek, Oswego County,

New York, around 1855 and was recorded there in the 1860 census. He was a Clerk of the Board of Education at Sandy Creek [*Oswego Daily Palladium* May 22, 1871] and a trustee at Sandy Creek in 1895. He married first Mrs. Martha Pruyn Ferguson, a daughter of Abraham Francis and Sophie (Minott) Pruyn, and widow of Mr. Ferguson. She died on April 23, 1874, at Sandy Creek and he married second Deborah A. Chapin on October 26, 1875, at Sandy Creek. She was born on June 18, 1843, at Carthage, Jefferson County, New York, and was a daughter of Harvey E. and Deborah (Fenton) Chapin. She died on December 20, 1918 [*Chapin Genealogy*]. Smith and Martha had no children; Smith and Deborah adopted one child: Walter A. Barlow, who was born on November 20, 1863, and later married Carrie Scofield.

iv. Walter A. Barlow was born around 1835-40 at Sheffield, Massachusetts [1840 census].

v. Victoria Frances Barlow was born on May 20, 1840, at Sheffield, Massachusetts [1840 census], or in Connecticut [1860 census]. She was a teacher and was recorded with her brother Smith at Sandy Creek in the 1860 census. She married Abram A. Kells. He was born on May 6, 1843, and died on July 24, 1920. She died on May 8, 1874, and both were buried in the St. Thomas Cemetery at Churchtown, Columbia County, New York.

vi. Angeline Barlow was born around 1840-48 and was probably the Angie M. Barlow of Winsted, Connecticut, who married A. M. Kelsey (or Kelsea) of Waterbury, Connecticut, on February 14, 1863, at Winsted [*Columbian Register, Waterbury American*].

14. Walker Barlow was born in 1816 [1860 census] in Dutchess County, New York, and was a son of 5. Morris and Sally (Stickle) Barlow. He was a farmer and in 1825 he moved to Conklin, Broome County, New York, where he was recorded in the 1855 and 1860 censuses. He died in 1898 and was buried in the Shawsville Cemetery at Conklin.
