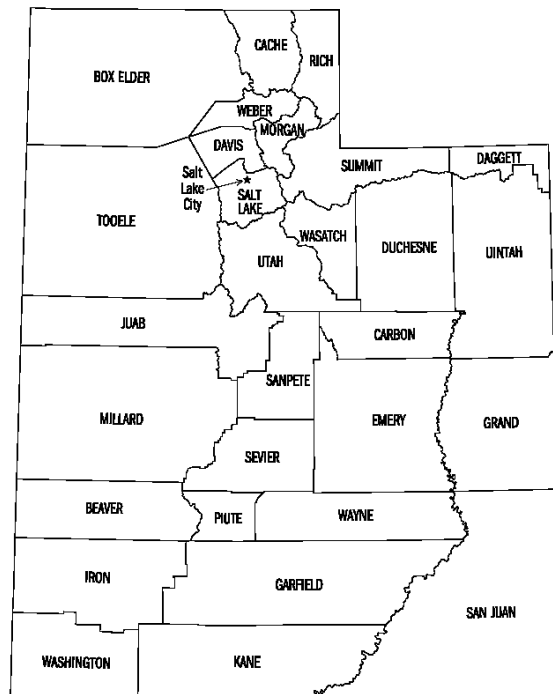

The Barlows of Utah

Israel Barlow and his family were among the first Barlows to settle in Utah. Ora Barlow, in his book "The Israel Barlow Story", says that they left Illinois and crossed the Mississippi River in mid June 1846. They spent the winter on the banks of the Missouri River with the main body of Mormons led by Brigham Young. They did not arrive at Salt Lake City until September 1848, and Israel built a log house on his assigned lot.



William L. and Hulda (Barlow) Brundage were also a pioneer family and their assigned lot at Salt Lake City was just to the north of Israel Barlow's lot. Hulda was born on March 5, 1807, at Neversink, Sullivan County, New York, was a daughter of Joseph W. and Anna (Gillett) Barlow, and a descendant of George Barlow of Sandwich, Massachusetts.

James Madison Barlow was also an

early Utah pioneer and either arrived with the main contingent led by Brigham Young or very soon after.

Utah's first federal census was in 1850 and two Barlow households were listed, Israel Barlow at Bountiful and James Barlow at Salt Lake City. Israel Barlow's household included his first wife Elizabeth and his children Israel, Permelia, Ianthius, John and Mary. James Barlow's household included a Martha Barlow, born in 1808 in Tennessee, and it is not known who she was.

Utah's second federal census in 1860 included Israel Barlow at Bountiful, and Oswald Barlow and James M. Barlow at Salt Lake City. Israel Barlow's household included his wives Elizabeth and Lucy, and his children Israel, Pamela, Ianthius, John, Mary, Wilford, Truman, and Sarah. Oswald Barlow's household included his wives Catherine and Mary, and his children Amanda, Lunes, Alice, James and Oswald. James M. Barlow's household included his wives Susan and Electa, and his children Joseph, Jane, James, Marrinda and Elizabeth.

The 1880 federal census showed a significant increase in Barlow households. There were new arrivals and many of the children of the original settlers now had their own families. Israel Barlow was listed, as were six of his sons who now had their own households. James M. Barlow was listed at Salt Lake City. Oswald Barlow's widows each had a household, as did his brother John, his son James and his son's widow Dorothy. Thomas Barlow and his son Walker each had a household. Kate Barlow, Amanda Barlow, Henry Barlow and Roswell Barlow had households. And there was a Private Thomas Barlow, born in Scotland,

listed with the 14th Infantry Regiment at Fort Cameron in Beaver County, Utah.

Israel Barlow

Israel Barlow was born on September 13, 1806, at Granville, Hampden County, Massachusetts, was a son of Jonathan and Annis (Gillett) Barlow, and was a descendant of Edmund Barlow of Malden, Massachusetts. He was recorded at Nauvoo, Illinois, in the 1840 federal census and at Bountiful, Davis County, Utah, in the 1850, 1860 and 1880 federal censuses. He died November 1, 1883, at Bountiful and was buried there in the Bountiful Cemetery.

Israel Barlow married four times. He married first Elizabeth Haven on February 23, 1840, at Quincy, Adams County, Illinois, and their children were James Nathaniel Barlow, born and died May 8, 1841; Israel Barlow, born September 5, 1842; Pamela Elizabeth Barlow, born September 6, 1844; Ianthius Haven Barlow, born May 1, 1846; John Haven Barlow, born July 27, 1848; Mary Antenett Barlow, born November 13, 1850; Willard Albert Barlow, born February 3, 1854, died October 28, 1854; and Wilford Elbert Barlow, born February 3, 1854.

Israel Barlow married second Elizabeth Barton on January 26, 1846, at Nauvoo, Hancock County, Illinois. She was born November 10, 1803, and died October 21, 1874. They had no children.

Israel Barlow married third Lucy Heap on December 2, 1855, at Salt Lake City, Utah, and their children were Truman Heap Barlow, born June 12, 1857; Sarah Isabel

Barlow, born June 26, 1859; Annis Janette Barlow, born September 30, 1860; Emma Jane Barlow, born August 19, 1862; Hyrum Heap Barlow, born August 30, 1864; Minnierette Barlow, born November 17, 1865; Granville Barlow, born July 31, 1867; and Nathan Barlow, born March 26, 1869.

Israel Barlow married fourth Cordelia Maria Dalrymple on May 27, 1865, at Salt Lake City. They had no children.

Israel Barlow and his first wife Elizabeth were recorded at Bountiful, Utah, in the 1880 federal census [National Archives Film T9-1336; Page 275C]. Israel's third wife Lucy, and their children Alice [Annis], Jane [Emma Jane], Hyrum, Minnie, Granville and Nathan, were recorded separately at Bountiful in 1880 [National Archives Film T9-1336; Page 272B]. Israel [Jr.] and Annie Barlow, and their children Israel, Annie, Mary, Permelia, John, Eva and Edmond, were recorded at Antelope Island, Davis County, Utah, in 1880 [National Archives Film T9-1336; Page 303D]. Ianthus Haven Barlow, his wife Hannah, and their children Ianthus, Jesse, Oscar, Hannah and Georgina, were recorded at Bountiful in 1880 [National Archives Film T9-1336; Page 280B]. John Barlow, his wife Elizabeth, and their children John and Elizabeth, were recorded at Bountiful in 1880 [National Archives Film T9-1336; Page 283C]. Wilford Barlow, his wife Laura and their daughter Florence, were recorded at Centerville, Davis County, Utah, in 1880 [National Archives Film T9-1336; Page 300A]. Truman Barlow, his wife Fanny and their son Truman, were also recorded at Centerville in 1880 [National Archives Film T9-1336; Page 297C].

James Madison Barlow

James Madison Barlow was born on July 9 or 12, 1812, at Georgetown, Scott County, Kentucky, and was a son of Thomas and Susanna (Isbell) Barlow. [Barlow of Barlow, Fall-Winter 1990, p 51, "Which Thomas Barlow?" by John O. Hawkins]. It is believed that he married first Elizabeth Susanna and her maiden surname may have been Barlow. There is no further record of her and it is not known what happened to her.

James Madison Barlow was a gold and silversmith, a jeweller, a watchmaker and a dentist. He was on his way to California, as the story goes, when Brigham Young persuaded him to join the Mormons and stay in Utah. He coined the first money in Utah and made many fine spoons from native silver. He died on February 8, 1893, at Salt Lake City.

James Madison Barlow married Susan (Susannah) Mott on November 17, 1852, at Salt Lake City, Utah. Their children were John H. K. Barlow, born July 19, 1853, died August 8, 1853; Jane Ferguson Barlow, born January 1, 1856; Joseph Barlow, born in 1857; Marrinda M. Barlow, born in 1858; Elizabeth Dwight Barlow, born March 31, 1860; and John Madison Barlow, born January 17, 1866.

James Madison Barlow married next Electa Mott on February 16, 1858, at Salt Lake City. Their children were James Mott Barlow, born October 17, 1858;; Catherine Barlow, born May 9, 1861; Samuel Mott

Barlow, born February 16, 1864, Electa M. Barlow, born 1868, and Joel Barlow, born 1872.

James Madison Barlow, his wife Susan M. Barlow, their children Joseph S., Jane F., James M., Lillie D. [Elizabeth Dwight], Kate [Catherine], Samuel M., John M., Electa M. and Joel, were recorded at Salt Lake City, Utah, in the 1880 federal census [National Archives Film T9-1337; Page 71C].

Oswald and John Barlow

Oswald and John Barlow were sons of James and Ann (Crompton) Barlow of Manchester, England. Oswald was born on July 22, 1829, at Manchester and came to the United States in 1850. He came to Utah in 1852 by driving a merchant team overland. He died April 23, 1876, at St. George, Washington County, Utah, and was buried there in the St. George Cemetery.

Oswald Barlow is believed to have married Catherine Nightingale around 1848 in England, although their marriage was subsequently recorded on April 11, 1856, at Salt Lake City. She was born on March 17, 1827, in England and came to Utah in 1853 with the Appleton Harmon company. Oswald and Catherine Barlow's children were James Barlow, born October 22, 1849, at Manchester, England; Oswald Franklin Barlow, born August 11, 1854; Amanda Barlow, born in 1856; Malinda Barlow, born April 7, 1858; David Henry Barlow, born September 15, 1860, and died November 22, 1870; Adrienne (or Aderina) Barlow, born 1860, Henrietta Caroline Barlow, born June 17, 1861; Willard Barlow, born June 12, 1863; and Joseph Ellis Barlow, born in 1865.

Oswald Barlow married second Mary J. Oliver on April 11, 1856, at Salt Lake City. She was born in 1831/1835 in England and was a daughter of William Oliver. Their children were William Henry Barlow, born August 6 or 16, 1855; Lunes Barlow, born March 21, 1857; Alice Louisa Barlow, born February 13, 1859; Albert George Barlow, born July 4, 1862; Heber Franklin Barlow, born September 6, 1866; Arthur Barlow, born August 6, 1871; and Herbert Barlow, born 1872.

Widow Catherine Barlow, her sons Willard and Joseph Barlow, her daughter Aderina (Adrienne) Wilson and her granddaughter Aderina Wilson, were recorded at St. George, Utah, in the 1880 federal census [National Archives Film T9-1339; Page 358D]. Widow Mary J. Barlow and her son Herbert Barlow were separately recorded at St. George in the 1880 federal census [National Archives Film T9-1339; Page 358C]. Oswald and Catherine Barlow's daughter Henrietta Barlow, their son James Barlow, his wife Anna C. L. Barlow, and their daughter Fanny C. Barlow, were recorded at Richfield, Sevier County, Utah, in the 1880 federal census [National Archives Film T9-1338; Page 486D]. Oswald Franklin Barlow's wife Dorothy and son Oswald were recorded at St. George in the 1880 federal census [National Archives Film T9-1339; Page 358D].

John Barlow, Oswald's younger brother, was born on August 3, 1838, at Manchester, England.

John Barlow married his niece Lunes Barlow on July 26, 1875, at Salt Lake City.

Their children were: John Barlow, born May 6, 1876, died November 15, 1891; James Edward Barlow, born December 9, 1878; Mary Ann Barlow, born October 8, 1879, died in infancy; Emma Jane Barlow, born June 17, 1881; Hyrum Barlow, born January 18, 1885; Ephraim Barlow

John and Lunes Barlow, their sons John and James Edward Barlow, and his widowed mother Ann Barlow, were recorded at Richfield, Sevier County, Utah, in the 1880 federal census [National Archives Film T9-1338; Page 486D].

Edward Barlow

Edward Barlow was born on August 14, 1801, at Unsworth, Lancashire, England, and was a son of John and Alice (Spencer) Barlow ["The Ancestral Heritage of George and Charlotte Barlow" by Raleigh Barlowe, 1988]. He married Elizabeth Crompton on May 26, 1820, at Prestwick, England, and they had four children. Elizabeth (Crompton) Barlow died in March 1834 in England and Edward Barlow died on November 9, 1877, at Ogden, Weber County, Utah.

Edward Barlow came to the United States with his children in 1857 and settled first in Allegheny County, Pennsylvania, where he was recorded in the 1860 federal census. In 1861 he and his family moved to Utah with the Joseph Horne company.

Edward and Elizabeth Barlow's children were Thomas Barlow, born June 13, 1823; William Barlow, born March 13, 1826; Ann Barlow and Sarah Barlow. Ann Barlow married Charles Root Dana on September 14, 1857, or on February 4, 1865,

at Salt Lake City, Utah, and Sarah Barlow married Mark Eastwood.

Thomas Barlow married first Ann Hulme on November 5, 1848, at Oldham, England. She was born on May 3, 1826, in Lancashire, England. She died on August 19, 1861, while traveling with the family from Nebraska to Utah and was buried near Deer Creek, Wyoming. Thomas and Ann Barlow's children were Walker Barlow, born June 9, 1851; Edward Barlow, born July 16, 1854; Elizabeth Ann Barlow, born October 31, 1856; George Thomas Barlow, born July 6, 1858, and Abraham Barlow, born May 23 1861, and died August 3, 1861, on the trip west.

Thomas Barlow married second Elizabeth "Eliza" Cato on August 29, 1863, at Salt Lake City, Utah. She was born February 1, 1831, at Tringe, England. Their children were Ann Priscilla Barlow, born October 16, 1863; Sarah Emaline Barlow, born December 10, 1865; Charles Cato Barlow, born September 18, 1867; Joseph Cato Barlow, born May 5, 1869; and Eliza Alberta Barlow, born September 18, 1872.

Thomas and Eliza Barlow, Edward Barlow, George T. Barlow, Ann P. Barlow, Joseph C. Barlow and Eliza A. Barlow were recorded at Ogden, Weber County, Utah, in the 1880 federal census [National Archives Film T9-1339; Page 419A]. Walker Barlow, his wife Clarissa A. Barlow, and their daughters Ann and May Barlow, were also recorded at Ogden in the 1880 federal census [National Archives Film T9-1339; Page 505C].

Henry Barlow

Henry Barlow was born in 1828 in Lancashire, England, and was a son of Thomas and Hannah (Bancroft) Barlow. He married Elizabeth Harriet Johnson on April 26, 1869, at Salt Lake City, Utah, and they settled at Springville, Utah County, Utah. She was born July 14, 1847, in England and was a daughter of Solomon and Caroline (Baker) Johnson [Mark L. Brunner, <http://freepages.genealogy.rootsweb.com/~barlow/>].

Henry Barlow died on January 25, 1888, and Elizabeth died on March 27, 1927. Both were buried in the Springville Cemetery.

Henry and Elizabeth Barlow, and their children, were recorded at Springville in the 1880 federal census [National Archives Film T9-1338; Page 175D]. Their children were Annis Caroline Barlow, born February 16, 1870; Nettie Victoria Barlow, born July 29, 1871; Phoebe Ellen Barlow, born October 10, 1872; Clara Alice Barlow, born November 20, 1874; Frank Bancroft Barlow, born on October 1, 1876, and died on June 28, 1879; Elizabeth "Lizzie" Matilda Barlow, born January 24, 1879; Mark Edward Barlow, born August 1, 1880, and died in 1890; Henry Thomas Barlow, born April 17, 1882, and died December 1, 1882; Austin Arthur Barlow, born October 13, 1883; Ernest Lorenzo Barlow, born December 8, 1885; and Harry Franklin Barlow, born August 13, 1887.

Joseph Smith Barlow

Joseph Smith Barlow was born in 1848 in England. He married Amanda Morgan on November 30, 1867, at Cedar Fort, Utah County, Utah. She was born April 27, 1852, in England and was a daughter of David and Hannah (Turner) Morgan.

Joseph Smith Barlow died on August 28, 1876, at Fairfield, Utah County, Utah, and was buried in the Fairfield Cemetery. Widow Amanda Barlow and her four children were recorded at Fairfield in the 1880 federal census [National Archives Film T9-1338; Page 256A]. On October 15, 1887, she married Valison Tanner. She died on January 24, 1931, and was buried in the Grouse Creek Cemetery, Grouse Creek, Box Elder County, Utah..

Joseph and Amanda Barlow's children were Joseph Smith Barlow, Jr., born January 27, 1870; Alice Ann Barlow, born September 24, 1872; Mary Emily Barlow, born February 8, 1875; and Jesse Barlow, born January 11, 1877.

SOME DESCENDANTS OF HENRY BARLOW of Shelby County, Indiana

Henry Barlow was born on February 5, 1786, in Washington County, Kentucky. He was a son of Lewis and Judah Francis (Smith) Barlow, and a fourth generation descendant of Christopher Parlur of the Germanna Colony in Virginia (Henry Barlow⁴, Lewis Barlow³, Jacob Barler², Christopher Parlur¹). He died on April 11, 1869, at age 83 in Polk County, Iowa, and was buried there in the Rising Sun Cemetery at Four Mile Township.

Around 1810, Henry Barlow moved to Adair County, Kentucky, with his parents and they were recorded there in the 1810 census. Around 1820 they moved to Indiana where they were recorded in Delaware County in the 1820 census. In the 1830, 1840 and 1850 censuses Henry Barlow was recorded at Jackson Township in Shelby County, Indiana, which was formed from Delaware County in 1822. Between 1850 and 1856, he and his family moved to Four Mile Township, Polk County, Iowa, where he was recorded living with his son Thomas Emory Barlow in the 1860 census.

Henry Barlow married Mary "Polly" Dawson on August 13, 1805, in Washington County, Kentucky. She died in 1820 and Henry and two of his sons were recorded in Indiana in the 1820 census. Their children were:

- + i. Lewis Barlow was born around 1806-1812 in Washington County, Kentucky.
- + ii. John Barlow was born on March 21, 1814, in Adair County, Kentucky.

+ iii. Henry Barlow was born in 1816 in Adair County, Kentucky.

+ iv. Benjamin Barlow was born on June 28, 1819, in Adair County, Kentucky.

Henry Barlow married second Mahala Kinslow (or Kinele, or Kinalo) on November 5, 1821, in Washington County, Kentucky. She was born in 1805 [gravestone] or in 1802 in Kentucky [1850 Census]. She was recorded with Henry at Jackson Township, Shelby County, Indiana, in the 1850 census. She died on March 29, 1857, at age 52 and was buried in the Rising Sun Cemetery, Four Mile Township, Polk County, Iowa. Their children were:

v. Judith Barlow was born about 1824 [1850 census]. She married first John Lisk on May 5 1842, in Shelby County, Indiana. He apparently died before 1850 because she was recorded with her parents as Judith Lisk in the 1850 census. She married second John Graham on April 4, 1852. She died on October 7, 1857.

vi. Jeremiah Barlow was born in 1828 [gravestone] or in 1827 in Indiana [1850 Census], probably at Jackson Township in Shelby County. He was recorded with his parents at Jackson Township in the 1850 census and moved with them to Polk County, Iowa. He died on February 6, 1856, at age 28 in Iowa and was buried in the Rising Sun Cemetery, Four Mile Township, Polk County, Iowa.

+ vii. Thomas Emory Barlow was born on March 29, 1829, in Shelby County, Indiana.

viii. Elizabeth A. Barlow was born about 1831. She married George W. Patterson on February 14, 1850, at Shelbyville, Shelby County, Indiana.

+ ix. Jesse Barlow was born on May 6, 1834, in Shelby County, Indiana.

x. Bird Barlow was born in 1839 in Indiana [1850 Census] or in 1841 in Indiana [1860 Census]. He was recorded with his parents at Jackson Township, Shelby County, Indiana, in the 1850 census and with his brother Jesse at Four Mile Township, Polk County, Iowa, in the 1860 census. He served in the Civil War as a Private in Company D of the 2nd Iowa Cavalry. He received a pension for his service and he lived in Polk County, Iowa, in 1880.

xi. William Barlow was born in 1842 [1850 Census] or 1841 [1860 Census] in Indiana. He was recorded with his parents at Jackson Township, Shelby County, Indiana, in the 1850 census and with his brother Jesse in Polk County, Iowa, in the 1860 census.

Fifth Generation

Lewis Barlow, sometimes called Louis Barlow, was born in 1806 [gravestone] or in 1812 in Washington County, Kentucky [1850 census], and was a son of Henry and Mary (Dawson) Barlow. He moved to Shelby County, Indiana, with his parents and was recorded there with his parents in the 1830 and 1840 censuses. In 1848 he moved to Rising Sun, Four Mile Township, Polk County, Iowa, where he was recorded as a farmer in the 1850 census. He died on October 25, 1854, at age 48 at Rising Sun and was buried there in the Rising Sun Cemetery.

According to *The History of Polk County, Iowa*, published in 1880, it was Lewis

Barlow who laid out the community of Rising Sun, in Sections 2 and 3 of Four Mile Township, in June 1854.

Lewis Barlow married first Mary Ann Pruitt on February 2, 1826, in Shelby County, Indiana. She was born on February 25, 1809, in Abbeville, South Carolina, and was a daughter of Moses and Elizabeth (Hawkins) Pruitt. She died on April 8, 1834, and was buried in the Pruitt Cemetery in Shelby County. Their children were:

+ i. John Henry Barlow was born on March 11, 1827, in Shelby County, Indiana.

+ ii. Moses Barlow was born on August 23, 1829, in Shelby County, Indiana.

iii. Mary Elizabeth Barlow was born in 1834, in Shelby County, Indiana. She was recorded living with her brothers John and Moses in Polk County, Iowa, in the 1850 census. She married William E. Depew in 1854 and they were recorded in Polk County in the 1860 census. They later lived at Clarinda, Page County, Iowa. He was born in 1831 and was killed by a train in 1897.

Lewis Barlow married second Ruth Bishop on January 5, 1840, in Clinton County, Indiana. She was born about 1823 in Indiana [1850 Census] and was the daughter of Steven and Margaret (Adams) Bishop. After Lewis' death, she married Samuel C. Oliver on August 13, 1857, in Polk County, Iowa, and they moved to Kansas where she died in 1861. Lewis and Ruth's children were:

iv. Henry Barlow was born in 1840 or 1841 [1850 census] in Shelby County, Indiana. He was recorded with his parents in 1850. He later moved to California. He served in the 1st California Regiment in the Civil War. After the war he lived at Emmetsburg, Palo Alto County, Iowa.

v. Stephen Conley Barlow was born on January 15, 1842, in Shelby County, Indiana. He was recorded with his parents in the 1850 census and with the J. M. Ferguson family at Four Mile Township, Polk County, Iowa, in the 1860 census. He married Ruth Clark Draper. He served in the Civil War as a Private in Company E of the 4th Iowa Infantry Regiment. He moved to Dawson, Richardson County, Nebraska, where he was a prosperous merchant. He died on January 3, 1878, at Dawson.

vi. Ann Elizabeth Barlow was born in 1846 in Shelby County, Indiana. She was recorded with her parents in 1850 and recorded with her brother Moses in 1860. She married Benjamin F. Cottrell.

vii. Margaret Jane Barlow was born in 1848 in Polk County, Iowa. She was recorded with her parents in 1850 and was recorded with her brother John in 1860. She married James W. Rooker.

viii. Alice Barlow was born in 1850 in Polk County, Iowa. She married Robert Skinner and they lived at Emmetsburg, Palo Alto County, Iowa.

ix. Lewis Barlow was born in 1852 in Polk County, Iowa. He was recorded living with his sister Mary Elizabeth in Polk county in the 1860 census.

John Barlow was born on March 21, 1814 [Family Bible, see page 518, *Barlow of Barlow*, August 2002], in Adair County, Kentucky, and was a son of Henry and Mary (Dawson) Barlow. He died on April 12, 1884 [Family Bible, see page 518, *Barlow of Barlow*], at Jackson Township, Shelby County, Indiana, and was buried there in the Mt. Auburn Cemetery.

John Barlow and his family were recorded at Jackson Township, Shelby County, Indiana, in the 1850 and 1860 censuses.

John Barlow married Ann Eliza Lisk on August 23, 1836, in Shelby County [Family Bible, see page 517, *Barlow of Barlow*]. She was born on January 23, 1818 [Family Bible, see page 518, *Barlow of Barlow*] in New Jersey [1870 Census] and was a daughter of Willet and Clarissa (Schanck) Lisk. She died on May 25, 1886 [Family Bible, see page 518, *Barlow of Barlow*], in Shelby County and was buried there in the Mt. Auburn Cemetery. Their children were:

+ i. Lewis Barlow was born on May 15, 1838 [Family Bible, see page 518, *Barlow of Barlow*] in Shelby County, Indiana.

ii. Clarissa Barlow was born September 7, 1840 [Family Bible, see page 518, *Barlow of Barlow*], in Shelby County, Indiana. She married Samuel T. Nelson.

Jesse Barlow married to Lucy J. Madden. She was born in 1839 in Pennsylvania. Their children included:

i. Martha Barlow was born in December 1859 in Iowa [1860 Census].

The History of Polk County, Iowa, 1880, gave the following about Jesse Barlow: "Farmer, section 3, P.O. Rising Sun. Was born in Shelby county, Indiana, May 6, 1834, and when in his eighteenth year removed from there to this county, where he has since resided. He received a common school education. Was married in this county to Miss Lucy J. Madden, a native of Pennsylvania. They have had four children, two of whom are now living at home.
