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## Barlows in the Revolutionary War

**Aaron Barlow** of Redding CT was a Second Sergeant in the 10th Company in the 5th Regiment of Connecticut Troops, commanded by Colonel David Waterbury, Jr. He participated in the Expedition of Generals Schuyler and Montgomery in the fall of 1775 for the capture of Montreal and Quebec. He was discharged on November 28, 1775. In the Fishkill Campaign, October 5-19, 1777, he served as Ensign in Captain John Gray's (9th) Company, 4th Connecticut Militia. In April 1780 he was commissioned Lieutenant in Captain Jesse Bell's Company, Colonel Bezaleel Beebe's Regiment of Connecticut Troops, and served 9 months on the Westchester front. His wartime diary, "Colonel Aaron Barlow's Book of Orders", was published in the American Historical Register III (1895-1896), pp 622-667.

**Aaron Barlow** of Rochester MA was a Private in Captain Nathaniel Hammond's Company of Colonel Ebenezer Sprout's Regiment of Massachusetts Militia. The regiment served 15 days in December 1776 when they marched from Rehoboth MA to Rhode Island on an alarm.

**Abner Barlow** of Granville MA was a Private in Captain Lebbeus Ball's Company of Colonel Timothy Danielson's Regiment of Massachusetts Militia. The regiment marched on April 20, 1775, in response to the alarm of April 19, 1775, (Battle of Lexington) and served 9 days. He enlisted again on April 29, 1775, in Captain Ball's Company for 3 months 10 days service and was listed on a Company return dated October 6, 1775, at Roxbury MA. He later enlisted on August 17, 1777, as a Private in Captain William Cooley's Company of Colonel John Moseley's 3rd Hampshire County Regiment of Massachusetts Militia, and was discharged after 4 days service.

**Abner Barlow** of Stratford NH enlisted in February 1777 as a Private in Captain Aldrich's Company of Major Benjamin Whitcomb's Independent Corps of New Hampshire Rangers under Colonel Hazen. He was later in the 9th Company of Colonel Reid's 2nd Regiment. He was in the Battle of Bennington (Vermont), at the capture of Burgoyne at Saratoga (New

York), and around October 15, 1781, was taken prisoner by a party of "British Indians" on the Onion River near Lake Champlain. He was taken to Montreal and was held there until the summer or fall of 1783.

**Abraham Burlew** of Middlesex County NJ served in the New Jersey Line.

**Ambrose Barlow** was a Private in the Virginia Militia.

**Ammitai Barlow** of Rochester MA was a Private in Captain Earl Clap's Company of Colonel Theophilus Cotton's Regiment of Massachusetts Militia. He served 12 days in the alarm of April 19, 1775, (Battle of Lexington). On May 2, 1775, he enlisted for 3 months 6 days service. He was a Sergeant and served 15 days in Captain Nathaniel Hammond's Company of Colonel Ebenezer Sprout's Regiment which marched from Rehoboth MA to Rhode Island on an alarm in December 1776.

**Benjamin Barlow** of Granville MA enlisted on September 21, 1777, as a Private in Captain William Cooley's Company of Colonel John Moseley's 3rd Hampshire County Regiment of Massachusetts Militia. He was discharged on October 23, 1777.

**Christopher Barlow** of Virginia was a Private in Captain Poynter's Company of the 7th Regiment of the North Carolina Continental Line from 1776 to 1778.

**Daniel Barlow** of Stratford CT was a Private in Captain Abel's Company of Colonel Bradley's Battalion of Connecticut Troops in 1776. He was a Corporal in Captain Lacy's Company of Colonel Bradley's 5th Regiment of the Connecticut Line in 1777-1778 and in Ensign Nichol's Company of Colonel Whiting's Regiment of the Connecticut Line in 1778.

**David Barlow** of Stratford CT was a sea Captain and commanded the *Anson* to

the West Indies in 1795 and 1796.

**David Barlow, Jr.** of Stratford CT was a Private in Captain Benjamin's Company of Colonel Silliman's Regiment of Connecticut Militia in 1776. He may have been the David Barlow who was a Private in Captain Booth's Company of Guards in Colonel Whiting's 4th Regiment of Connecticut Militia in 1777 and in Captain Coe's Company of Colonel Whiting's Regiment in 1778.

**David Barlow** of Fairfield CT was a Private in the Continental Line before 1780.

**David Barlow** was a Matross in Captain Robert Walker's 4th Company of Colonel John Lamb's Regiment of New York Artillery in 1777.

**Ebenezer Barlow** of Granville MA was a Private in Captain Lebbeus Ball's Company of Colonel Timothy Danielson's Regiment of Massachusetts Militia. The regiment marched on April 20, 1775, in response to the alarm of April 19, 1775, (Battle of Lexington) and served 9 days. He enlisted on April 29, 1775, again in Captain Ball's Company for 3 months 10 days service. He was discharged on November 17, 1776.

Ebenezer Barlow of Hardwick MA enlisted on July 5, 1780, as a Private in Captain Timothy Paige's Company of Colonel John Rand's Regiment of Massachusetts Militia. He served at West Point NY and was discharged on October 10, 1780.

**Ebenezer Barlow** of Rochester MA enlisted May 2, 1775, for 3 months 6 days service as a Corporal in Captain Earl Clap's Company of Colonel Theophilus Cotton's Regiment of Massachusetts Militia. He served 15 days as a Sergeant in Captain Nathaniel Hammond's Company of Colonel

Ebenezer Sprout's Regiment and marched from Rochester to Rhode Island on an alarm in December 1776. He served 65 days in Captain William Tupper's Company of Colonel Titcomb's Regiment in May and June 1777 at Rhode Island. He served 32 days in Captain Samuel Briggs' Company of Colonel Cotton's Regiment of General Palmer's Brigade and marched to Tiverton RI on a secret expedition on September 29, 1777.

**Edmund Barlow** of Fairfield CT was a Private and was taken prisoner at Fairfield in 1779, but his Company and Regiment have not been determined.

**Edmund Barlow** of Granville MA received his first commission as a First Lieutenant on April 26, 1776, and joined the Hampshire County (MA) Militia Regiment commanded by Lieutenant Colonel Timothy Robinson. He next saw service in Captain William Cooley's Company of Colonel John Moseley's 3rd Hampshire County Regiment. He enlisted on October 21, 1776, and was discharged on November 17, 1776, after 28 days service to reinforce the Northern Army. He subsequently enlisted on July 31, 1779, in Captain Solomon Brown's Company of Colonel Elisha Porter's Hampshire County Regiment. He was discharged on September 1, 1779, after 1 month 6 days service at New London CT.

**Eliakim Barlow** of Middleboro MA was a Private and served 3 days in Captain Shaw's 1st Company which marched on the alarm of April 19, 1775, (Battle of Lexington), to Marshfield MA. He subsequently enlisted on May 3, 1775, for 3 months 6 days service as a Sergeant in Captain Joshua Benson's Company of Colonel Theophilus Cotton's Regiment. Later he was a Private in Captain Nehemiah Allen's Company of Colonel Cotton's Regiment and served 31 days in September and October 1777 when the company marched on a secret expedition to Rhode Island.

**Elisha Barlow** of Amenia NY was commissioned as Ensign in Captain Joshua Lasell's 3rd Company of Colonel Southerland's 6th Dutchess County Regiment of New York Militia on October 17, 1775. He was subsequently a Captain in Colonel Morris Graham's Regiment of General Clinton's Brigade of the New York Line in 1776.

**Ephraim Barlow** of Culpepper County VA.

**George Barlow** of Rochester MA was a seaman in the Revolutionary War.

**Heman Barlow** of Granville MA enlisted on September 23, 1776, as a Private in Captain William Cooley's Company of Colonel John Moseley's Regiment of Massachusetts Militia and was discharged on November 16, 1776. On May 6, 1777, he enlisted in Captain William Cannon's Company of Colonel David Leonard's Regiment of Massachusetts Militia, marched to Ticonderoga NY and was discharged on July 14, 1777. On September 21, 1777, he enlisted in Captain Aaron Coe's Company of Colonel Moseley's Regiment, marched on an alarm to reinforce the Northern Army and was discharged on October 23, 1777. In 1780 he served 21 days as a Private in Captain Thomas Barney's Company of Colonel Ira Allen's Regiment of Vermont Militia on an alarm to the north which commenced on October 11, 1780.

**Hensen Barlow** of Tennessee.

**Henson Barlow** of Jefferson County VA was a Private in the 7th Regiment of Infantry. He received a pension and died on September 3, 1828.

**James Barlow** of Virginia was a Private.

**Jesse Barlow** of Sandwich MA was a Private in Captain Ward Swift's Company which marched on the alarm of April 19, 1775, (Battle of Lexington). He was subsequently a Sergeant in Captain Swift's Company of Colonel Freeman's Regiment of Massachusetts Militia which marched to Dartmouth and Falmouth MA on an alarm on September 6, 1778. He was later stationed on Staten Island NY.

**Jesse Barlow** of Virginia is listed in the D.A.R. Patriot Index.

**Joel Barlow** of Redding CT enlisted in Colonel Huntington's Regiment of the Connecticut Line and took part in the Battle of White Plains (NY) on October 28, 1776. He was subsequently appointed Chaplain to Colonel John Bailey's 4th Massachusetts Brigade and served from May 1, 1780, to December 31, 1780.

**John Barlow** of Kent CT enlisted on May 7, 1777, as a Private in Captain Albert Chapman's Company of Colonel Heman Swift's 7th Regiment of Connecticut Militia. He was subsequently in Captain Comstock's Company of Colonel Swift's 2nd Connecticut Regiment, Captain Cogswell's Company of Colonel Moseley's Connecticut Regiment, Captain Chamberlain's Company of Colonel Swift's 2nd Regiment, Captain Manning's Company of the 3rd Connecticut Regiment, and in Colonel Hinman's 4th Connecticut Regiment. He was in the Battles of Germantown and Monmouth, served in one campaign in 1775 and all of 1776.

**John Barlow** of Stratford CT was commissioned to command the boat *Betsey* and on December 18, 1780, he captured the British sloop *Tartar* in Oyster Bay, Long Island NY. The *Betsey* was taken in turn by the British in March 1781, and Captain Barlow surrendered and was held in the prison ship *Jersey* in New York harbor.

**John Barlow** of Maryland was a Private in the Frederick Detachment of the

Maryland Line in 1782-83 and in Captain Bruce's 4th Company of the Northern Detachment of the Maryland Line in 1783. He may have been the John Barlow who was a Private in Captain Bayly's Company of the 7th Maryland Regiment in 1778.

**John Barlow** of Danby VT was a Private in Captain Campbell's Company of Colonel Hazen's Regiment in 1778.

**John Barlow** of Massachusetts was commissioned an Ensign on May 19, 1775, and served in Captain Amos Turner's Company of General Thomas' Regiment.

**John Barlow** of Massachusetts was commissioned an Ensign on May 19, 1775, and served in Captain Amos Turner's Company of General Thomas' Regiment.

**John Barlow** of South Hadley MA enlisted on June 22, 1778, and served 9 months in Captain Montague's Company of Colonel Porter's Regiment.

**John Barlow** was a Private in the 6th Company of Colonel Cilley's 1st Continental Regiment. He later was on the Committee of Safety from Peterborough NH on July 12, 1782.

**John Barlow** of Pennsylvania enlisted on June 9, 1779, and was a Matross in Captain John Jordan's Company of Colonel Flower's Artillery of the Pennsylvania Continental Line.

**Joseph Barlow** of Hardwick MA enlisted on July 5, 1780, as a Private in Captain Timothy Paige's Company of Colonel John Rand's Regiment of Massachusetts Militia. He served at West Point NY and was discharged on October 10, 1780.

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## Barlows in the Revolutionary War (continued)

**Joseph Barlow** of Rochester MA served 6 months in the Continental Army. He enlisted on June 5, 1780, and arrived at Springfield MA on July 9th. He marched to camp on July 10th under the command of Captain Daniel Shay. He was discharged on December 1, 1780.

**Joseph Barlow** of Boone County KY was a Private in the Virginia Line.

**Lemuel Barlow** of Lee MA enlisted on July 22, 1777, as a Private in Captain William Francis' Company of Colonel John Ashley's Regiment of Massachusetts Militia. He served 23 days and was discharged on August 13, 1777. He subsequently re-enlisted on October 12, 1781, as a Private in Captain Josiah Yale's Company and marched on an alarm from Lee to Stillwater NY by order of General Rossiter. He served 12 days and was discharged on October 20, 1791.

**Levi Barlow** of Sandwich MA served 3 days as a Private in Captain Ward Swift's Company which marched on the alarm of April 19, 1775, (Battle of Lexington). He subsequently was a Sergeant in Captain John Grannis' Company from Barnstable MA and served from July 8 to December 31, 1775, at Elizabeth Islands. Later he served as a Private in Captain Samuel Fisher's Company of Colonel Freeman's Regiment which marched on an alarm at Dartmouth and Falmouth MA in September 1779.

**Lewis Barlow** of Virginia enlisted in September 1776 in Staunton County VA and served as a Private in Captain Michael Bowyer's Company of Colonel James Wood's 12th Virginia Regiment from 1776 to 1779. He also served in the 4th and 8th Virginia Regiments, and he participated in the Battles of Iron Hill, Brandywine, Germantown, and many skirmishes. He was discharged at West Point NY.

**Micah Barlow** of Woodstock CT served in Captain Morris' Company of the

11th Regiment of Connecticut Militia from 1778 to 1781.

**Moses Barlow** was master of the schooner *Lyon* which was captured on May 1, 1776, off Block Island while bound from Cape Francis to Rhode Island. The captured schooner was sent to Halifax as a prize of war on May 23, 1776.

**Moses Barlow** of Amenia NY is listed in the D.A.R. Patriots Index as having served in Public Service.

**Moses Barlow** of Massachusetts enlisted on April 2, 1778, as a Private in Captain Micah Hamlin's Company of Colonel Jonathan Reed's 1st Regiment of Massachusetts Militia. He marched on April 7, 1778, and served 3 months at Cambridge MA.

**Moses Barlow** of Sandwich MA was a Private in Captain Ward Swift's Company of Colonel Freeman's Regiment of Massachusetts Militia. He served in October 1777 and 10 days in September 1778.

**Moses Barlow** of Dutchess County NY was a Private in the 6th Dutchess County Regiment of New York Militia. He was discharged at Fishkill NY.

**Nathan Barlow** of Massachusetts enlisted on June 16, 1778, for 8 months as a Private in Captain John Carpenter's Company of Colonel Ezra Wood's Regiment of Massachusetts Militia.

**Nathan Barlow** of Dutchess County NY was on a list of Dutchess County NY Associators. He enlisted in the 6th Dutchess County Regiment of the New York Militia and obtained land bounty rights.

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### More on John Barlow of Fairfield, Connecticut

Mrs. Marion Case wrote about our article on John Barlow of Fairfield, Connecticut, in the last issue of Barlow of Barlow (page 137) and included a copy of page 63 of Andrew Sherwood's 1929 book Daniel L. Sherwood and His Paternal Ancestors. Andrew Sherwood gave yet another undocumented ancestral lineage of John Barlow: "1. Robert Barlow; 2, Thomas; 3, Roger; 4, Roger; 5, Sir John Roger de Barlow (Knight); 6, John de Barlow; 7, Nicholas; 8, Alexander; 9, Sir Alexander de Barlow (Knight); 10, George; 11, John -- who

was the immigrant." On another page he mentions that this line "is said to be one of the few American lines of ancestry which can be traced back with authoritative proof" but gives no reference or clue to that proof.

Andrew Sherwood also mentions "Samuel Kimbrough Barlow, Oregon pioneer from Kentucky, [who] built the first wagon road across the Cascade mountains ... [in] 1845-46." He makes no connection to John Barlow other than the surname.

**Nathan Barlow** of Amenia NY was listed as Private in the D.A.R. Patriots Index.

**Nathan Barlow** of Stratford NH was a Private in Captain Eame's Company of New Hampshire Rangers in 1776. He enlisted in Captain House's Company of Colonel Morey's Regiment of New Hampshire Militia in 1777. He was

subsequently commissioned an Ensign in Captain Samuel Runnal's Company of Major Whitcomb's Rangers on June 29, 1780, and then a Lieutenant in Captain Caswell's scouting party at Strafford NH.

**Nathan Barlow** of Virginia.

John BARLOW received land in the 1807 Land Lottery in Georgia. We know they did go to what was then Mississippi Territory and settled in what is now Perry County, Mississippi. We know John BARLOW lived in North Carolina in 1791-1794 for he had two sons, Bryant and Henry, who were born in North Carolina, according to census records. I would appreciate any help.

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John BARLOW of Robeson County, North Carolina, was born about 1771. He married Lydia --?-- of North Carolina and by 1820 they moved to Mississippi where both died. Their son Henry BARLOW married first Charity MILLSAPS and second Miranda HAYMAN who was born in 1815 in Georgia.

Ulysses Green BARLOW, a son of Henry and Miranda, was born in 1852 in Copiah, Mississippi. He married Cornelia NOLAND who was born in 1847 at Copiah.

Hooker BARLOW, a son of Ulysses and Cornelia, was born in 1875 at Copiah. He married Mabel MONTGOMERY and their daughter Claudie Mae BARLOW was my mother.

Does anyone have any information on John and Lydia BARLOW of Robeson County, North Carolina? They were in the Robeson County census in 1790 and 1800. Where was he born? His parents? What about Lydia? Does she have a last name? Where is she from?

**Nathaniel Barlow** of Redding CT was appointed to procure military supplies for the militia in 1777.

**Nehemiah Barlow** of Massachusetts was a Private in Captain Anthony Post's Company of Artillery Artificers in General Henry Knox's Brigade.

**Nicholas Barlow** of Virginia.

**Obed Barlow** of Sandwich MA served 3 days as a Private in Captain Ward

Swift's Company, in Captain Hedge's Company of Major Cushing's Regiment and in Captain Smith's Company on duty at Sandwich guarding the shore.

**Obed Barlow** of Rochester MA was a Private and served 7 days in Captain Earl Gray's Company of Colonel Theophilus Cotton's Regiment, 15 days in Captain Nathaniel Hammond's Company of Colonel Ebenezer Sprout's Regiment, and 32 days in Captain Samuel Briggs' Company of Colonel Cotton's Regiment.
