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James Barlow of New York and Ontario

Most of the following information has been obtained from a *History of the Barlow Family*, 1937, by Mrs. T. R. Sheridan of Soperton, Ontario, Canada. Further information has been added from other sources as indicated by brackets.

First Generation

1. **James Barlow** was born about 1804 in England [1871 Ontario Census] and the identity of his parents is not known. In 1828 he and his brother John Barlow, both of the Town of Grantham, Lincolnshire, England, came to America and settled at Watertown, Jefferson County, New York, where he married and started raising a family. After the birth of their three sons, the family moved to Canada and settled at what is now Fairfield, Leeds County, Ontario. A few years later they relocated to Lot 18 in the 9th concession of the township of Bastard, Leeds County, two miles from Delta (then called Beverly), on what for nearly a century was known as the "Barlow Farm" consisting of 400 acres. He was recorded as

a farmer at Bastard, Ontario, in the 1871 census. When his wife died in 1879 he went to live with his son Robert at Addison, Ontario. He died on December 21, 1890, at age 86 at Elizabethtown Township, Ontario.

James Barlow married Ellen McDonald of Brownville, Jefferson County, New York, in 1830. She was born about 1805 in England [1871 Ontario Census]. She died in 1879, probably at their farm in Ontario. Their children were:

3. i. James Barlow was born around 1830-33 probably in New York although his birthplace was given as Ontario in the 1871 Census.

4. ii. Robert Barlow was born around 1832-4 in New York.

5. iii. William Barlow was born in 1837-8 in New York [1871 Ontario Census].

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James Barlow (continued)

iv. Mary Ann Barlow was born on April 8, 1841, in Canada. She married Levi Church near Addison and they had nine children. She died on August 25, 1901, at Elizabethtown Township, Ontario.

v. Hannah Jane Barlow was born about 1844-5 in Ontario [1871 Ontario Census]. She married George Baker on February 29, 1872, and they lived at Brockville, Ontario. She died in 1920 at 76 and was buried at Brockville.

2. John Barlow was born in England. Nothing further is known about him.

Second Generation

3. James Barlow was born around 1830-33 [1871 Ontario Census] probably in New York, although his birthplace was given as Ontario in the 1871 Census. He was a son of 1. James Barlow and Ellen McDonald. He was recorded at Bastard, Ontario, in the 1871 census.

James Barlow married Jane DeWolfe of Kitley township near Frankville, Leeds County, Ontario, in 1858. She was born around 1830 in Ontario [1871 Ontario Census]. They lived on the Barlow homestead. She died on December 1, 1879, at age 35. Most of the Barlow family are buried in the cemetery at the New Boyne Anglican Church. He died on March 5, 1918. Their children were:

6. i. Joel Barlow was born about 1858 [1871 Ontario Census].

7. ii. Joseph Barlow was born about 1860 [1871 Ontario Census].

iii. Margaret Barlow was born about 1861-3 [1871 Ontario Census] and never

married. She lived with her father on the Barlow farm until his death when she moved to Delta to live with her younger sister. She died on March 25, 1933, at age 70 and was buried at New Boyne.

8. iv. Edward Barlow was born about 1863-5. He was recorded as James Barlow, age 7, in the 1871 census.

v. Evalena or Evelin Barlow was born about 1865 [1871 Ontario Census]. She married William Birch, the son of Robert Birch, on January 1, 1895. They had one daughter, Vera Elizabeth Birch, born on July 4, 1897.

vi. Robert Barlow was born about 1867 [1871 Ontario Census]. He died of diphtheria on December 13, 1862, at age 14 [this seems wrong - probably should be 1882]. He was buried at New Boyne.

vii. Jane Barlow was born about 1869. She was recorded as Hannah Barlow, age 1, in the 1871 census. She married Gordon McKee of Spencerville, Ontario, on February 10, 1897. They lived at Iroquois for a few years and then moved to Yorkton, Saskatchewan, in 1910.

4. Robert Barlow was born in New York around 1832-4 [1871 Ontario Census] and was a son of 1. James Barlow and Ellen McDonald. He was recorded as a cheese manufacturer at Brockville, Ontario, in the 1871 census.

Robert Barlow married Martha Davis of Unionville, now Forthton, Ontario, in 1870. They settled on a farm near Addison. He died at the age of 79 having served as deputy reeve and reeve of Elizabethtown for 15 years. Their child was:

i. Adelaide Barlow was born around 1870. She married J. M. Percival.

5. William Barlow was born in New York around 1838 [1871 Ontario Census] and was a son of 1. James Barlow and Ellen McDonald. He never married and he was recorded as a cheesemaker and living with his father at Bastard, Ontario, in the 1871 census. He was badly hurt by a fall from his horse in 1864. Failing to recover his health, he went to England in 1869 to consult a physician, returning the same year, and died very suddenly in 1876 at age 39.

Third Generation

6. Joel Barlow was born about 1858-9 in Ontario [1871 Ontario Census] and was a son of 3. James and Jane (DeWolfe) Barlow. He was recorded with his father at Bastard, Ontario, in the 1871 census. He died on August 7, 1934. He married Lucy Jane Earl of Philippsville, Ontario, on May 18, 1883, and they had four children:

i. Wilbert Barlow.

ii. Edward Barlow.

iii. Edna Barlow married Gerald Cannon and they lived on a farm near Portland, Ontario. They had four children: Earl, Billy, Betty and Myra.

iv. Addie Barlow married Ben Dougall who was postmaster at Lyndhurst, Ontario.

7. Joseph Barlow was born about 1860-1 in Ontario [1871 Ontario Census] and was a son of 3. James and Jane (DeWolfe) Barlow. He was recorded with his father at Bastard, Ontario, in the 1871

census. He married Addie Soper, the daughter of Torence Soper, on May 7, 1891, at Soperton, Ontario. He bought the Rufus Gilbert farm at Lyndhurst Station, Ontario. He lived there until his health failed and he moved to Pembroke, Renfrew County, Ontario, in 1897 to conduct a grocery business. Two years later he moved to Nepun, Manitoba, and 26 years later to Vancouver, British Columbia, and then to Edmonton, Alberta, changing climate every so often for relief from an asthmatic condition which finally was the cause of his death on October 25, 1932, at 71. He was buried at Edmonton.

8. Edward Barlow was born about 1865 and was the son of 3. James and Jane (DeWolfe) Barlow. He built a new house on the old homestead. He sold his farm and moved to Delta when he received the appointment as postmaster of the village in June 1922. He died on March 5, 1929, at age 64. Manada died on June 3, 1935, at her Delta home where her daughter Norma and family lived. They were buried in the Stevens Cemetery at Delta.

Edward Barlow married Manada Seaman of Chantry, Ontario, on September 25, 1888. They had three children, the eldest dying at birth:

i. a stillborn child.

ii. Seaman Barlow was born on August 27, 1893. He was a banker and he married Jessie Davison, the daughter of Daniel and Hannah Davison of Delta. They moved to Oak River, Manitoba.

iii. Norma Barlow was born on June 19, 1897. She married Lloyd Irwin, the son of Henry Irwin of Soperton, on April 2, 1919, and they lived at Delta.

New E-Mail Version

The *Barlow of Barlow* newsletter is available in both a postal mail (paper) version and an e-mail version. The e-mail version is now available in either of two formats: a plain text (ASCII) version sent as an e-mail message or an Acrobat .PDF version sent as an e-mail attachment.

The Acrobat .PDF version has the advantage that it retains all the original page layout, including any illustrations and tables. It requires the Adobe Acrobat Reader 3.0 software but this is available at no charge by downloading it from Adobe's website www.adobe.com on the internet. Using the free Acrobat Reader software, you may either read the newsletter on your computer monitor screen or you may print out a copy on your printer. Dot matrix printers make a reasonable and adequate copy but inkjet or laser printers will make a perfect duplicate of the original, including illustrations, type styles, etc.

The current subscription rate for the postal mail version is \$10 annually. If you wish you may receive both the paper version and the e-mail version for the same \$10 rate.

If you want only the e-mail version, the subscription rate is \$5 annually. For current subscribers wanting only the e-mail version, I will double the remaining number of issues on your subscription.

Edward Barlow, of Pennsylvania and Utah

In 1988, Raleigh Barlowe, a descendent of Edward and Betty (Crompton) Barlow, published an excellent and very complete history of this family, entitled *The Ancestral Heritage of George and Charlotte Barlow*. Because this book covers this family so well only a basic compilation of Edward Barlow's descendents will be given here. Most of the information given here is from this book. Other sources of information, which are shown in brackets, have confirmed the accuracy of the data in the book.

First Generation

1. Edward Barlow was born on August 14, 1801, at Unsworth, Lancashire, England, and was a son of John Barlow (1764-1834) and Alice Spencer (1761-1809). He died on November 9, 1877, at Ogden, Utah.

Edward Barlow was a weaver and he came to the United States from England in 1857. He was recorded living with his son Thomas at Shaler Township, Allegheny County, Pennsylvania, in the 1860 census. He and his family moved to Utah with the Joseph Horne company and arrived there on September 13, 1861.

Edward Barlow married Elizabeth "Betty" Crompton on May 26, 1820, at Prestwich, England. She was born on July 4, 1802, at Prestwich and was a daughter of William Crompton (1772-) and Mary Ashworth (1773-). She died in March 1834. Their children were:

2. i. Thomas Barlow was born on June 13, 1823, at Prestwich.

3. ii. William Barlow was born on March 13, 1826, probably in England.

iii. Ann Barlow married Charles Root Dana on September 14, 1857, or on February 4, 1865, at Salt Lake City, Utah [IGI].

iv. Sarah Barlow married Mark Eastwood.

Second Generation

2. Thomas Barlow was born on June 13, 1823, at Prestwich, England, and was a son of 1. Edward and Elizabeth (Crompton) Barlow. He died on October 16, 1896, at Ogden, Utah.

Thomas Barlow came to the United States in 1855 and settled initially in Pennsylvania where his wife had two brothers. He was recorded at Shaler Township, Allegheny County, Pennsylvania, in the 1860 census. In 1861 he and his family moved west to Utah and settled there at Ogden.

Thomas Barlow married Ann Hulme on November 5, 1848, at Oldham, England. She was born on May 3, 1826, at Little Heaton, Lancashire, England, and was a daughter of George Hulme (1794-1865) and Ann Barlow (1793-1853, a sister of Edward Barlow). She died on August 19, 1861, while travelling with the family from Nebraska to Utah and was buried near Deer Creek, Wyoming. Their children were:

4. i. Walker Barlow was born on June 9, 1851, in England. He married Clarissa A. Barker.

5. ii. Edward Barlow was born on July 16, 1854, in England. He married Lizzie Flowers.

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Edward Barlow (continued)

iii. Elizabeth Ann Barlow was born on October 31, 1856, at Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania [IGI]. She married Tobias Furniss on April 27, 1882, at Salt Lake City, Utah [IGI]. She died in 1933 in Utah.

6. iv. George Thomas Barlow was born on July 6, 1858, at Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. He married Sarah Coop.

v. Abraham Barlow was born on May 23, 1861, at Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. He died on August 3, 1861, while travelling with his parents from Nebraska to Utah.

Thomas Barlow married second Elizabeth (or Eliza) Cato on August 29, 1863, at Salt Lake City, Utah [IGI]. She was born on February 1, 1831, at Tringe, England, and was a daughter of Charles and Ann (Higbee) Cato. Their children were:

vi. Ann Priscilla Barlow was born on October 16, 1863. She married John Tillotson on September 20, 1883, at Salt Lake City, Utah [IGI].

vii. Sarah Emaline Barlow was born on December 10, 1865.

7. viii. Charles Cato Barlow was born on September 18, 1867.

8. ix. Joseph Cato Barlow was born on May 5, 1869.

x. Eliza Alberta Barlow was born on September 18, 1872 (or September 2, 1872, at Ogden, Utah [IGI]). She married Leander Harris.

3. William Barlow was born on March 13, 1826, probably in England and was a son of 1. Edward and Elizabeth (Crompton) Barlow.

William Barlow was recorded at Allegheny City, Allegheny County, Pennsylvania, in the 1860 census.

William Barlow married Ann Lees. She was born in 1827 in England [C1860]. Their children were:

i. Charles Barlow was born in 1849 in England [C1860].

ii. Sarah Barlow was born in 1852 in England [C1860].

iii. Sharlot Barlow was born in 1854 in England [C1860].

iv. Adam Barlow was born in 1859 in Pennsylvania [C1860].

Third Generation

4. Walker Barlow was born on June 9, 1851, at Blakely Lane, Lancashire, England, and was a son of 2. Thomas and Ann (Hulme) Barlow. He died on July 2, 1933, at Ogden, Utah. He married Clarissa Ann Barker on November 18, 1876, at Ogden [family records] or on April 27, 1882, at Salt Lake City, Utah [IGI]. She was born on April 13, 1859, at Ogden and was a daughter of Simon and Jemima (Newey) Barker. She died on January 19, 1926. Their children were:

i. Ann Jemima Barlow was born on August 20, 1877, at Ogden [IGI]. She married Levi J. Taylor Jr.

ii. Leah May Barlow was born on January 9, 1879, at Ogden [IGI]. She married Christopher H. Burton.

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Edward Barlow (continued)

iii. George Walker Barlow was born on December 16, 1880, at Ogden [IGI]. He died on October 22, 1954, at Salt Lake City. He married Marilla Plumb Hunter on April 16, 1915, at Salt Lake City.

iv. Simon Barlow was born on November 4, 1882, at Ogden [IGI].

v. Alice Barlow was born on April 20, 1885.

vi. John Frederick Barlow was born on March 31, 1889, at Ogden [IGI].

vii. Joseph Willard Barlow was born on September 9, 1891, at Ogden [IGI].

viii. Ezra Thomas Barlow was born on January (or June) 4, 1895, at Ogden [IGI].

ix. Ellis Edward Barlow was born on August 15, 1899, at Ogden [IGI].

5. Edward Barlow was born on July 16, 1854, and was a son of 2. Thomas and Ann (Hulme) Barlow. He married Elizabeth "Lizzie" L. Flowers on November 1, 1883, at Salt Lake City, Utah [IGI]. Their children were:

i. Harriet Ann Barlow was born on April 17, 1885, at Ogden, Utah [IGI].

ii. Mary Irene Barlow was born on August 9, 1890, at Salt Lake City, Utah [IGI].

6. George Thomas Barlow was born on July 6, 1858, at Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, and was a son of 2. Thomas and Ann (Hulme) Barlow. He died on April 13, 1929, at Salt Lake City, Utah. He married Sarah Coop on October 25, 1883, at

Salt Lake City, Utah [IGI]. She was born on August 5, 1865, at Belle Isle, Yorkshire, England, and was a daughter of William Coop (1826-1875) and Martha Hurst (1832-1902). She died on September 8, 1949, at Inglewood, California. Their children were:

i. Martha Barlow was born on November 30, 1884, at Ogden, Utah [IGI].

ii. George Edward Barlow was born on November 1, 1888, at Preston, Franklin County, Idaho [IGI]. He died on August 15, 1962, at Los Angeles, California. He married Charlotte L. Campbell on September 18, 1913.

iii. Sarah Coop Barlow was born on February 22, 1891, at Ogden, Utah [IGI].

7. Charles Cato Barlow was born on September 18, 1867, and was a son of 2. Thomas and Elizabeth (Cato) Barlow.

8. Joseph Cato Barlow was born on May 5, 1869, and was a son of 2. Thomas and Elizabeth (Cato) Barlow.
