Barlow and Waldron Families of Canada

Friends can be made and family connections can be found through exchanges made on the internet. Within this past year I made contact with a distant cousin in my Tyson family who has provided more material to document our common ancestors. He has really learned to research on the internet and has shared some wonderful insights with me. Just a few weeks ago he gave me the *Barlow of Barlow* address because the Waldron name surfaced through the February 1996 issue. I would like to share some history of our family showing that connection from our prospective.

I was born in Cheyenne, Laramie County, Wyoming. I was born Ann Tyson, daughter of Ray and Mary Heiman Tyson. My dad is descended from Wyoming pioneers who moved there from Nebraska in the 1890's. The Nebraska pioneer was named Abiathar Tyson. Abiathar Tyson and

his wife, Ellen Worf Boughen Tyson moved to Cass County, Nebraska in 1866 from DeKalb County, Illinois. Through our own family history we learned that Abiathar's parents were John Henry David Tyson and his wife, Malinda Waldron. John H. D. Tyson and Malinda Waldron were married March 24, 1824, in Williamsburg, Church of England, (recorded in Liber B, Register 61, Anglican Archives, Ottawa, Ontario, Canada). Malinda's father was named Abiathar Waldron. John Tyson was a Methodist circuit preacher until he was 80 years old. He had immigrated to America from Hamburg, Germany. We know this from Illinois census records and from the obituary telling of his career that was published in *The Universalist Companion and Almanac of 1862*. He had converted to the Universalist faith at the age of 80 and

preached in that doctrine until he was almost 90 years of age. This couple had six children:

1. William Henry Tyson
2. Abiathar Tyson (the compiler's ancestor)
3. Sarah Tyson
4. Harriet Tyson Rowen
5. Silas Tyson
6. Louisa Florilla Tyson Hollenbeck

We learned about Malinda Waldron Tyson's parentage through family tradition and also a story of the family that was published in some Cass County Nebraska biographical sketches (*The Biographical Album of Otoe and Cass Counties, Nebraska*, Vol. II, 1889). There it says that John David Tyson married in Canada, Malinda Waldron, a native of Chittenden County, Vermont. Other clues to follow were found in the Cass County sketches. "Abiathar Waldron, at the time of the Revolution, being too young to enlist went into the army as a servant, but was mustered into the ranks ... after the war he went to Vermont, and in 1798 married a daughter of Mr. Evarts, and settled on a farm in Williston (Chittenden County, Vermont). He subsequently sold his land there and moved to Quebec, Canada, becoming one of the pioneer farmers of that section of the country. When the Canadian Rebellion broke out in 1838, he sold his Canadian possessions, and moved to St. Lawrence County, New York. In 1840 he bought a farm there, on which he lived until his death in April 1841." We have learned that the Mrs. Waldron who "survived her husband, dying in 1846" is his second wife, Abigail Hutchins Clark. My husband and I have visited the cemetery in Norfolk, St. Lawrence County, New York, where the Waldrons are buried. In our study we have found that the children of Abiathar Waldron and an unnamed Evarts lady were the

following:

1. Malinda Waldron, born ca. 1787, married John David Tyson in 1824.

2. An unnamed son born before 1791.

3. Florilla Waldron, born July 3, 1800, died April 5, 1893, Kemptville, Oxford Township, Ontario, Canada, married Horace Hutchins in 1826. In Marvin Hutchin's book, *Nicholas Hutchins of Lynn and Groton, Massachusetts, and His Descendants* (Boyer, Santa Clarita, CA, 1989, p. 74) it is said that Horace Hutchins "was generous in his contributions to the Methodist Church in Canada. His will provided legacies to the "Superannuated Fund of the United Methodist Church in Canada to and for the use of the old and retired clergy of said Church; the Home Mission of said Methodist Church to be paid to a missionary by said trustees for missionary services in the Canadian Northwest; the Methodist French Mission work of the Province of Quebec; for the Methodist Japan mission work; for the Montreal Auxiliary Bible Society formed in Montreal in 1820; the Deaf and Dumb Institute at Belleville, Ontario; the Ottawa Protestant Orphans Home at Ottawa; purchase of a Protestant Cemetery at Kemptville; the Minister in charge of Canada Methodist Congregation, Kemptville; part payment of a bell for the tower of the Methodist Church at Kemptville; and the Okate Indian Mission Church at Kemptville. He also remembered many relatives." We learned from researchers in Prescott, Ontario, that he had left \$100 each to two Tyson relatives in Nebraska who had been named for him and his wife Florilla-Horace Hutchins Tyson and Florilla Hutchins Tyson

(who first married a Breedon and secondly married a Scott).

4. An unnamed daughter (believed by a Barlow researcher to be named Sarah Waldron) who had a daughter, Obedience Cook, who married Stephen Barlow. Stephen and Obedience had had a daughter named Florilla Adalaide Barlow who was adopted by Horace Hutchins and Florilla Waldron Hutchins, who had no children of their own. In Marvin Hutchin's book, *Nicholas Hutchins*, page 74, it is found that Florilla Adalaide Barlow and her husband, William Henry Keegan, had four children, all born in Oxford Mills, Ontario and surnamed Keegan:

- a. Berthruide Maria Keegan, born April 13, 1878, married Wesley Keegan, son of Robert and Elizabeth Mulloy Keegan.
- b. Henry Hutchins Keegan, born April 14, 1880, married Nellie Johnston.
- c. William James Keegan born July 12, 1890, married Mary Shand who was born in Scotland. This couple lived in Oxford.
- d. Mary Adalaide (Minnie) Keegan, born July 12, 1890, married Frederick Robert Sherrard.

The information that we have found concerning this fourth child of Abiathar Waldron seems to mesh with the family described in the February, 1996, issue of the *Barlow of Barlow* newsletter, that is, that Obedience Cook, daughter of James Cook and Sarah Waldron, married Stephen Barlow and had a daughter named Florilla Adelaide Barlow. We had never been able to give her a name until we read the copy of the

newsletter.

5. An unnamed son born after 1791.

6. Linus Waldron, born ca. 1794, living in Argenteuil County, Quebec, in 1851 with wife Harriet.

7. Silas Waldron, born 1804, Lachute, Argenteuil County, Quebec. He and his wife Sephronia Burch are buried in Norfolk, St. Lawrence County, New York.

8. Abiathar Waldron, Jr.

In the *History of the Counties Argenteuil, Quebec, and Prescott, Ontario*, (compiled by C. Thomas, first printed in 1896, and reprinted in 1981 by Mika Publishing Co., Belleville, Ontario, pp. 195-198) several interesting stories were told of the town of Lachute in Argenteuil County, Quebec. Hezekiah Clark was said to be the first settler of the little town. He was soon followed by John S. Hutchins and his brother, Phineas Hutchins. It was written that Hezekiah Clark had come to Lachute in 1796 from Jericho, Vermont. Marvin Clayton Hutchins in his book *Nicholas Hutchins of Lynn and Groton* says that Abigail Hutchins, a daughter of Phineas Hutchins and Abigail Reed was born on March 13, 1766, in Lunenburg, Massachusetts, and married first Hezekiah Clark (p. 32, 33). Shortly after their marriage, Hezekiah and Abigail moved to Jericho, Vermont, and then to Lachute. In Marvin Hutchins' study of the Hutchins family I found that Abigail Hutchins Clark was a sister to the boys, John S. and Phineas Hutchins, mentioned above, all children of the older Phineas and Abigail Reed Hutchins. Another sibling, Joshua Hutchins,

was the father of Horace Hutchins, who married Florilla Waldron, daughter of Abiathar Waldron.

In a sketch contributed by E. S. Orr following the general history of Lachute, Orr describes Abiathar Waldron as one of his father's neighbors. "He had been a soldier of the Revolutionary side, I think on the American side his wife was a Hutchings [sic] and was said to be the first white woman in Lachute". Orr wrote that the Waldrons were Methodist and "Father Waldron's" home was a lodging place for itinerant circuit preachers. "His wife was not the mother of his sons, Linus, Silas and Abiathar." Her first husband's name was Clark. It was said that Clark "took a grist to the Lachute mills to be ground, and that while waiting for the grist, he went to fish for salmon, which were then to be had below the dam, and was drowned".

Orr wrote that "Mr. And Mrs. Waldron, at a very advanced age, finally returned to the States, I think, about 1836." Indeed we have been able to obtain Abiathar Waldron's pension record for his service in the American Revolutionary War as well as evidence that he lived his last years in Norfolk, St. Lawrence County, New York. The land records there though reveal that his son, Silas Waldron, held the deed to land there. Silas and his wife, Saphronia Burch Waldron, are buried next to Abiathar and his second wife, Abigail.

Our Abiathar Tyson, son of John David Tyson and Malinda Waldron, is said to have been born in South Gore, Ontario. A couple people in our family have written to researchers connected with the Grenville Historical Society in Ontario who found the marriage of Melinda Wauldron [sic] to John Tyson, March 24, 1824. The researchers

also found Florilla Waldron's marriage in 1826 (in Vol. 61 of the Williamsburg, Ontario, register of the Anglican Archives, Diocese of Ottawa) to Horace Hutchins of Oxford Township, Grenville County, son of Joshua Hutchins. These researchers studied the will of Horace Hutchins, saying that he left land to Adelaide Keegan, who was a "great niece" of Florilla Waldron Hutchins. My husband and I visited that society's little library in Prescott in the fall of 1996. We found a Hutchins family file in which there were letters from various family researchers. In a letter from some unknown Hutchins descendant they had received information that Florilla Adelaide Barlow was born in Binbrook, Upper Canada, on February 1, 1853, and married William Henry Keegan on October 3, 1876. On another sheet at the Grenville County Historical Society in Prescott, Ontario we found the burial records of Horace Hutchins, born LaChute, lower Canada, in September 1802, and his wife, Florilla Waldron, born Lachute, Lower Canada, on July 3, 1800, died April 5, 1893. No sources were given for the information, but at the bottom of the sheet was written: "Florilla Waldron Hutchins was an aunt of Obedience Cook who married Stephen Barlow, father of Florilla Barlow, grand aunt of Florilla Barlow Keegan and great grandaunt of Horace Hutchins Keegan.

A Rodney Keegan was mentioned in a letter written by Marvin Hutchins as being a "descendant of Adelaide Barlow and William Henry Keegan." According to the dates of the letters it seems that Rodney was still living in the 1980's. The Grenville County researchers mention that Florilla Hutchins' will was dated May 11, 1891, and registered November 10, 1897. It left all real and personal property to Florilla

Adelaide Keegan, wife of William H. Keegan of Oxford. Keegan and William H. Anderson of Kemptville were to be executors.

In conclusion I would like to say that I have given only the bare bones of the story of our family. I have tried here to show the parallels of our research to that which was done on the Stephen Barlow and Obedience Cook family and hope that these parallels may strike a cord in the mind of another researcher of this family. Much more remains to be done to document what has been found by way of several narratives. We were led to believe several years ago that the Canadian records cannot be copied by xerox machines. Can anyone confirm this? The compiler would be most interested to share information with others who are

connected to these families. We do have some documents to prove some of our lines, but hope to find more and would welcome ideas on how best to do this. We wonder if anyone may have family Bible records to corroborate some of these family lists. I would especially be interested in corresponding with descendants of the branch of Stephen Barlow and Obedience Cook Barlow's family. We would like to be able to document and prove that Sarah Waldron, who is said to be the wife of James Cook and mother of Obedience Cook, is the same girl who in our history is the unnamed oldest daughter of Abiathar Waldron and his unnamed wife, ----- Evarts. John Barlow of Montgomery County, Indiana

The Barlow family by Ruth Margaret (Barlow) Lee is a manuscript history of this branch of the Barlow family (LDS Library 929.273 A1 no. 6846, microfilm 1697587 item 12). Most of the information given here is from this book. Other sources of information, which are shown in brackets, have confirmed the accuracy of the data in the book.

First Generation

1. **John Barlow**, origin unknown, was born about 1805. He was probably the John S. Barlow recorded in Montgomery

County, Indiana, in the 1840 census and who was 30-40 years old [born 1800-1810] with a 20-30 year old wife [born 1810-1820], a 15-20 year old son [born 1820-1825], a 5-10 year old daughter [born 1830-1835] and two daughters under 5 [born 1835-1840].

John Barlow married Sarah ---- (perhaps either Young or Hamilton). She was born on February 6, 1808, in Kentucky. She was recorded at Ripley, Montgomery County, Indiana, in the 1850 census and at Center Township, Marshall County, Indiana, in the 1860 census. She died on February

22, 1872, at age 64 years 16 days and was buried in the old cemetery near Inwood, Indiana. Their children were:

2. i. George B. Barlow was born in 1836 [1850 census] or in 1841 [1860 census] in Indiana. Nothing further is known about him.

3. ii. Francis Marion Barlow was born on November 11, 1844, in Montgomery County, Indiana.

Second Generation

3. Francis Marion Barlow was born on November 11, 1844, (or born on September 20, 1844 [IGI]) in Montgomery County, Indiana, and was a son of 1. John and Sarah Barlow. He died on May 3, 1915, at Argos, Indiana, at age 71 years 22 days and was buried there in the Soldiers Cemetery.

Francis Marion Barlow served in the Civil War in Company E of the 12th Indiana Cavalry under General William Tecumseh Sherman. He enlisted on December 20, 1863, at Plymouth, Indiana, and he was mustered out on November 18, 1865, at Vicksburg, Mississippi. He received a pension for his service.

Francis Marion Barlow married Elizabeth Emaline Church on June 9, 1866, in Fayette County, Indiana. They were married at her parent's residence by the Rev. Oliver Silvey. She was born on October 27, 1849, in Fayette County. She died on November 7, 1934, at Argos, Indiana, at age 85 years 11 days. Their children were:

i. Philora Jane Barlow was born on

January 2, 1869, in Marshall County, Indiana. She died on the day she was born.

ii. Cora Alice Barlow was born on February 8, 1869, in Marshall County, Indiana. She was adopted.

iii. Sarah Mariah Barlow was born on November 16, 1871, at Inwood, Marshall County. She married Douglas Neiswonger in Marshall County.

4. iv. William Warren Barlow was born on July 22, 1873, at Inwood, Marshall County [IGI].

v. Aretta Armanda Barlow was born on March 2, 1878, at Inwood, Marshall County. She married Ebbon Parrish.

5. vi. Charles Clifford Barlow was born on November 7, 1879, at Inwood, Marshall County.

6. vii. Isaac Leslie Barlow was born on March 14, 1882, at Inwood, Marshall County.

Third Generation

4. William Warren Barlow was born on July 22, 1873, at Inwood, Marshall County, Indiana [IGI], and was a son of 3. Francis Marion and Elizabeth Emaline (Church) Barlow. He died on June 27, 1957, at Argos, Marshall County, Indiana.

William Warren Barlow married Emma Jane Bowman on March 29, 1907, at Old Fort, Ohio. She died on March 26,

1947, at Argos, Indiana. Their children were:

i. Joseph Marion Barlow was born on March 15, 1908, at Argos, Marshall County, Indiana.

ii. Isaac Harold Barlow was born on December 3, 1909, at Argos, Marshall County, Indiana.

iii. Francis Elizabeth Barlow was born on December 7, 1911, at Argos, Marshall County, Indiana.

iv. Hulda Ann Barlow was born on March 30, 1914, at Argos, Marshall County, Indiana.

v. Ruth Margaret Barlow was born on October 30, 1920, at Argos, Marshall

County, Indiana.

5. Charles Clifford Barlow was born on November 7, 1879, at Inwood, Marshall County, Indiana, and was a son of 3. Francis Marion and Elizabeth Emaline (Church) Barlow. He did not marry.

6. Isaac Leslie Barlow was born on March 14, 1882, at Inwood, Marshall County, Indiana, and was a son of 3. Francis Marion and Elizabeth Emaline (Church) Barlow. He died on June 12, 1955, at Argos, Indiana.

Isaac Leslie Barlow married Hattie D. Witmer on August 10, 1916. They had no children.

More Barlow Gold

Previously in *Barlow of Barlow* mention has been made of various Barlows and their involvement with gold. In the May 1995 issue, page 179, stories were told of Francis N. Barlow finding gold while plowing the fields of his farm at Greenwich, Massachusetts, and Otis P. Barlow losing his life and his gold when he was returning home from California.

Now the story is told of finding gold on land owned by Darius R. Barlow at Ashford in Windham County, Connecticut. Darius was Born in 1848 At Ashford and was a son of Reuben and Eunice (Snow) Barlow. He was a seventh generation descendant of George Barlow of Sandwich,

Massachusetts (Darius⁷, Reuben⁶, Reuben⁵, Micah⁴, William³, John², George¹). He died in 1944 and was buried at Exeter, New Hampshire.

The following is an article dated Wednesday, June 22, 1881, Ashford, Connecticut, from the *Willimantic Chronicle*.

“We are undergoing another period of gold excitement occasioned by what appears to be gold in rocks situated in Westford. At the time that E.A. Buck & Co. were running their glass factory in Westford, they had occasion to use a certain kind of rock which

existed there, in the manufacture of glass, which was crushed fine, and then melted with other materials and made into glass, and at that time small particles were seen in the bottles much resembling gold, and also a sediment was left in the pots in which the materials were melted and it had every appearance of gold, and some considerable excitement was occasioned by the discovery, but the glass company looked more to the judicious management of the glass business, than to the rock from which they obtained their material, for their gold, so that the matter rested quietly for awhile, but still there was a lingering impression in the minds of some that gold did exist in these rocks and so strong was that impression that a company was organized, and operations commenced to ascertain whether there was really gold there or not. Several different assays were made giving from four to fifteen dollars per ton, but no one seemed to want to risk any money in the enterprise, and so the matter has been permitted to rest until a short time ago when a new discovery was made in which it really did appear as though there might be gold in paying quantities, and a specimen of the rock was sent to New York, and the returns from the assay gave twenty seven and one-half dollars to the ton. This of course, would pay to work, and New York parties have been consulted in regard to the mine and are willing to put up some capital if it is going to pay. Last week three hundred lbs of the rock was sent to New York, and if the assay reaches near \$30 per ton, means will be furnished at once to work the mine. In the meantime parties here are anxiously awaiting the returns of this last shipment, and if the report is all right then of course they can begin to reckon their wealth by millions. This last discovery was made in what is known as 'Beston Hollow,' situated a little easterly of Westford village, a deep gorge in the hills, just wide enough

for a public highway to be made, and is some two miles in length, with high, rocky, precipitous banks on either side, towering some one hundred and fifty feet above the road, and looks as though the hills might have been rent in twain by some terrible convulsion of nature. Chas. F. Huntly who has devoted a great deal of time and labor to developing a mine in which he is interested is said to be the discoverer of this place which gives the gold business in Westford new life. The discovery was made on a piece of land lately purchased of Chas. L. Dean, by Darius R. Barlow and was considered valuable only for the timber standing upon it. But after this discovery was made, Stephen Lewis of Brooklyn, N.Y., and C.F. Huntly of Westford have each taken a third interest in this tract of land and have now employed several hands that are working to develop the mine. So confident are the parties that gold does exist there that they have purchased several hundred acres adjoining, and if the last assay proves all right, one hundred men will at once commence work, and machinery will be sent from New York for crushing and milling the rock. The services of Charles Chollar of Killingly has been secured, who is an old miner, having been through the California mines and was the discoverer of the 'Chollar mine' once so famous for its rich deposits, and is said to be the best judge of specimens in the United States, and says that the specimens are richer in appearance than any thing he has ever seen in any western mine. There has been no doubt in the minds of many of our citizens that gold really existed in Westford, but that it was not in sufficient quantities to pay the expense of working. But now it looks as though our fondest hopes of wealth are to be realized. Yet we still remember how delusive is the dream of sudden wealth."
