Dear Barlow kindred. We have had much response to this project and some of you have become members.

We have had much interesting material to print from various parties in many locations and will print as time and space permits. In this issue, I wish to tell a little on my own BARLOW ancestry and then you who relate to it may let me know:

My great grandfather, William Edgar Coppage, whom I knew as a young boy, being the oldest grandson in the family, was born in Harrison County, KY., son of Peyton and Jane (Barlow) Coppage. I have an excellent picture of this lady who was the daughter of ELIPHALET BARLOW, born 1 June, 1777 in Virginia and who died 20 March, 1868 in Harrison County, KY. He married MILDRED 'MILLIE' BARLOW, daughter of THOMAS BARLOW, R W Patriot who came from Campbell County, VA to Nicholas County, KY. We do not know how the husband and wife were related. The wedding took place 5 July 1801 in Bourbon County, KY

In turn, ELIPHALET, who also had a nephew by the same name, was the son of Rev JOHN BARLOW of Virginia, an early settler of Wilkes County, NC. As yet, we do not know for sure where the Rev. Barlow had lived in Virginia. We do know that among his children were: MARY b 17 Nov 1772, m JACOB CROUCH

ELIZABETH, m John CARLTON, 14 Aug 1802

RUTH, b 30 Sept 1771, m John WALLACE to Volga? IN

JOHN JR., who stayed in the Wilkes County and adjoining area

We also expect that there were other children, but will not speculate at this time. Also would like to know the name of the wife of REV JOHN BARLOW. Several suggestions have been offered, none with any particular proof.

AS to the parentage of REV. JOHN, we are also in the dark there as well. It is possible and he would have been about the right age to have been a son of JOHN BARLOW, b ca 1726, who married 18 March 1749 to Hannah DAMERON, daughter of Lazarus and Elizabeth SMITH DAMERON of Albemarle County, VA. Since the Coppage family were also descended from the Dameron family, this may have some bearing on the marriage of my great grandfather to Jane Barlow, but that is just guess work.

Any information on this line of BARLOWS, either THOMAS or REV JOHN will be greatly appreciated. We have proven that the wife of THOMAS was not the one who had been ascribed to him, a MOTT lady of the Eastern shore of Virginia.

CHAPTER VII.  
THE AMERICAN BARLOWS

Connection with Slebech

THE earliest contact of a Barlow with the North American continent seems to be in connection with:—

"The first voyage made to the coasts of America with two Barks wherein (Captains Master) Philip Amadas and (Master) Arthur Barlowe . . . discovered part of the country now called Virginia, Anno 1584."

This was the first expedition sent out by Sir Walter Raleigh: the expedition started on April 27th, 1584, reached the West Indies on June 10th, and returned by the middle of September; the account expressly states that the expedition came back to report and did not stay in Virginia.

Captain Arthur Barlow, as appears from the document itself, wrote the account, but he gives no details of himself, nor is there any evidence of the family to which he belonged, or that he ever returned to Virginia: but as he expressly states that he sailed from, and returned to, the "West of England," he very possibly was related to the Slebech branch, and this connection may have fired him to carry on Roger's fine tradition of American exploration.

The next appearance of a Barlow on American soil occurs in 1623, when we find Henry Barlow living on a plantation at James City, Virginia, but nothing seems to be known either of his ancestors or of his descendants.†

The Barlows in America are a numerous clan, and took a definite and indeed noteworthy share in the early settlement of New England from about 1635 onwards. It is, however, by no means easy to trace the connection of these early Barlow settlers, either with one another, or with their ancestors in the old country. The index to American Genealogies‡ gives a fairly long list of authorities, of which the following are available in London, and have been consulted by the author:—

These contain numerous disconnected references to various Barlows, but do not outline any comprehensive pedigree. The author was, however, fortunate enough in the course of a recent visit to the States to establish contact with Miss C. B. Barlow, of 1364 Girard Street N.W., Washington, D.C., who kindly introduced to him a typescript volume of American Barlow records carefully compiled by Laura Campbell Hawkins and Emma Campbell De Vries in 1930 (referred to below as A.B.R.). Useful information has also been received from Mr. Samuel Barlow, of 11, Grammercy Park, N.Y.; and from the Institute of American Genealogy, of 440, South Dearborn Street, Chicago.\*

George Barlow, who was the root of the main stock from which the New England families appear to have sprung, was an historical figure of very considerable importance.† The date of his birth, presumably in England, is unknown, but he appears to have emigrated in 1635,‡ was at Exeter, Mass., in 1639, and at Saco, Maine, in 1653: he preached at both places, being then apparently in orders as a clergyman of the Church of England, but he was forbidden, in 1653, by the Puritan General Court of Massachusetts to preach or prophesy, whereupon he started to practise law. He took the oath of Fidelity at Sandwich in 1657, having previously settled there, and he married first the daughter of Vincent Stetson, of Milford, and that prior to 1650, as he is mentioned in the latter's will of that date: § this wife died in Sandwich about 1667, leaving five sons, Aaron, Moses, Samuel, George and William. George Barlow then married as his second wife, Jane, widow of Anthony Besse, by whom he had two sons, John and Nathan. The Government of Plymouth Colony, in order to keep Quakers under control, was forced to appoint State Constables, and George Barlow was sent as Special Marshall in 1658 to the Cape Cod area, namely, Sandwich, Barnstable and Yarmouth; he seems to have treated the Quakers with no little severity, and is often referred to as the "Cruel Marshall."¶

The Records should be consulted for fuller details of his career; his will was proved on October 31st, 1684, and that of his second wife Jane on October 5th, 1693.

Who were George Barlow's parents? It is always dangerous to ignore established tradition, and in this case tradition seems fairly clear that George Barlow was son of William Barlow, the Archdeacon of Salisbury, famous for his works on navigation, who was himself the son

of Bishop William Barlow of Chichester, and who died and was buried at Easton, Hants, in 1625, of which he was Rector for 48 years, from 1577 to 1625.\*

The will of Archdeacon William Barlow† has been examined at Somerset House, and mentions his brother John and three sons, Thomas, William, and Barnaby, but not a son George, though George was a familiar name in other branches of the Slebech family. On the other hand, as George was apparently in Episcopal orders prior to his arrival in New England, which probably took place about 1635, it is very likely that he sprang from an ecclesiastical family. He may be identical with George, son of Richard Barlow of Orton, Westmoreland, who entered Queen's College, Oxford, December 9th, 1636, aged 16, and was brother of Thomas Barlow, Bishop of Lincoln, 1675-1691;‡ but, if so, he must have landed in America several years later.§

The early settlers naturally made a merit of large families; the New England Barlows were no exception: the authors of A.B.R. have worked out tables of numerous descendants, including the female lines, from George Barlow down to the tenth and even the eleventh generations, representing some 250 persons at the present day. It is not possible to print in full these tables here, but a sketch pedigree is annexed showing descent as far as a grandson Peleg, who married Elizabeth Perry, great-granddaughter of John Cooke, last male survivor of the *Mayflower*; and who with his family in 1692, though then well over 60, courageously left Sandwich, sailed up the Hudson to Poughkeepsie, and settled in Amenia, N.Y. Amenia became the main home of this family for some eight further generations, down to 1930 (A.B.R., p. 140). Descendants have in recent years settled in Iowa, Indiana, California, etc., but the early family names, e.g., Mehitabel, Moses, Nathan and Peleg, appear constantly in all the branches. Peleg|| in particular figures in practically every one of these Barlow households, and in each of the eight generations, from 1700 to the present day.

The most distinguished member of the clan in America is presumably Joel Barlow,¶ who was famous as a poet, a politician and

a diplomat. He was born at Redding, Conn., March 24th, 1754, and studied at Dartmouth College and at Yale. He wrote the *Columbiad* (1787), but his best-known production is the *Hasty Pudding*. The friend of Paine and Fulton, and of the founders of the American Constitution, he was sent on a Mission to France in 1788 and as Consul-General to Algiers in 1795-97. He returned to America in 1805 and remained there until 1811, when he was appointed Ambassador of the United States and Minister Plenipotentiary to France; in November, 1812, he made the difficult winter journey to Wilna hoping to meet the Emperor and negotiate a treaty, but the latter had been defeated at the Beresina and was retreating on Paris; Joel Barlow's mission having failed, he turned back, was taken ill, died, and was buried at Zarnowice, near Cracow, on December 24th, 1812.\*

Joel was the great-great-grandson of John Barlow of Fairfield, who was living in Fairfield in 1668 and died there in 1674; his son John and grandson Samuel lived on in Fairfield, but the latter's son Samuel moved to Redding in 1740 and acquired an estate near Bradley Hill; Joel Barlow was Samuel's fourth son† by his second wife.

The connection, which seems very probable, of Joel's great-great-grandfather John Barlow of Fairfield with the family of George Barlow of Sandwich does not appear to have been clearly worked out; but John Barlow seems to have been held entitled to the arms of Barlow of Slebech, presumably on the basis of his descent from George Barlow of Sandwich and the latter's connection with the Archdeacon of Salisbury.‡

Francis Channing Barlow, born October 19th, 1834, in Brooklyn, New York, who rose to be a Major-General in the Civil War, and was subsequently Secretary of State in the State of New York and Attorney General, has sons now living in Boston; his grandfather was David Barlow of Windsor, Vermont, died 1807, and his connection with the descendants of George Barlow of Sandwich appears probable, but has not so far been traced.

Descendants tracing connection with the clan in the old country are also to be found in Canada and Newfoundland: Dr. W. R. Barlow of Port-aux-Basques shows his descent from the Lancs. branch, and his great-great-grandfather was Joseph Barlow, Governor of Chetham's Hospital, Manchester, 1775-1808, buried at Rotherne, Cheshire.

John Barlow, an early pioneer of Caldwell County, first owned land and settled in Kings Creek (then Wilkes County). The earliest land grant recorded for him was in 1789. Little else is known about John Barlow, except that many of his descendants live in Caldwell County. He may have been the John Barlow who served so many churches in Wilkes (and Caldwell) as pastor.

From John Barlow's will of 1855 and other sources, most of the children of his rather large family can be identified.

Polly, probably John Barlow's oldest daughter, married Meredith Walker and died before 1855. Her children were Sarah, who married ? Maltba, Emily and Ariminda.

Elizabeth, who married Martin Livingston, was the mother of Tom Livingston and several other children.

Nancy, who married Thomas Coffey, son of James and Delilah Ferguson Coffey, was the mother of Nancy, who married David Ernest, 17 October 1858; Thomas, who married Amanda Sherrill, 21 January 1861; John, Rufus; and Larkin. Thomas and Amanda Sherrill Coffey were the parents of Sarah Coffey and Smith Coffey. Thomas died before 1871 and Amanda Sherrill Coffey remarried to Noah Keller 22 March 1871.

Joseph Barlow was probably the oldest son of John Barlow. He married Louisa Laxton. Joseph and Louisa Laxton Barlow had ten children. Calvin Barlow, their oldest son, married Meritta Bentley 4 March 1854 and moved to Watauga County, N.C. Their daughter, Mary Demouris, married Milas Keller 31 December 1874. After Meritta died, Calvin married Mary Tilley, the daughter of Hosa and Nancy Tilley. Pickins Barlow (4 April 1838 — 5 June 1924) married Sarah Laxton 3 February 1871. Sarah was the daughter of Allen and Polly Powell Laxton. Their children were Walter, Minnie and Maud. Pickins Barlow served in Co. A, 22nd Regiment CSA and was wounded and captured at Gettysburg, Pennsylvania. After the war, he was one of the men who freed this territory from the terror of the marauders of Fort Hamby.

The other eight children of Joseph and Louisa Laxton Barlow were Joel, who married Mary Hartley 21 July 1876; Julia (18 July 1853 — 17 April 1940), who married Alva Barlow; Jane, who married Thomas Knight; Levi, who married Ella Kirby; Elvira, who married Lewis Holder; Caroline, who married Milton Sherrill 25 June 1862; Maryanne, who married W. Lute Coffey 5 March 1874; and Albert, who died young.

Larkin Barlow, son of John Barlow, married Edith Knight and after her death, he married Nancy E. Humphrey, 7 February 1865. His children were Edith S., John L., Sarah E., Samuel T., Thomas W.

John Barlow had five other sons: Eliphalet Barlow; Henry Barlow, a school teacher, who married Matilda Kirby and moved to Watauga Co., N.C.; Braxton Barlow, who married Charlotte Carlton and lived in Wilkes County; Parrish Barlow, who married Mary (?) Land; and William R. Barlow.

The children of Parrish and Mary (?) Land Barlow were Horton Barlow, who married Nancy Maltba; Hamilton Barlow, who married Cynthia Ferguson; Charlotte, Julia; Dycy; Emily; and Milkie who never married and became a schoolteacher.

William R. Barlow, the youngest son of John Barlow, married Jane Burch 22 December 1818. Their son was John O. Cromwell Barlow. Jane died before 1828 and William R. Barlow remarried to Lydia Winkler, daughter of Mathais and Catherine Arney Winkler. Their children were Thomas, who married Saphronia Turner 12 September 1857 and William Rufus, who married (1) Mary Ann German 3 February 1859 and (2) Elizabeth German.

## WILLIAM RUFUS BARLOW

William Rufus Barlow was born October 13 1827, the son of William Barlow and his second wife Lydia Winkler. Rufus married first Mary Anne German, daughter of Wilburn German and they had one son, Marshall. After Mary Anne's death, Rufus married Elizabeth German, daughter of James German, and they had one son, Sidney.

Rufus enlisted in the Civil War in Iredell County on August 20, 1862. He was assigned to company "B" of the 18th Regiment of the North Carolina Volunteer Infantry Army of Northern Virginia, U.S.A., as a private. He was present and accounted for until captured at Spotsylvania Court House, Virginia, on May 12, 1864. He was imprisoned first at Point Lookout, Maryland, and later transported to Elmira, New York where he died of pneumonia while a prisoner of war on 31 January 1865. A great-great-grandson of Rufus Barlow is in possession of several letters which Rufus wrote to his wife Elizabeth while in the army. One of the letters reads as follows:

October 28, 1862 Dear Mother I oft times think of you in your old age & how Bad I want to Be with you to take care of you after dewing so much for me I want you to pray for me for your self & let us try to meet in heaven if we dont or earth Elizabeth God love you all to pray for me while I am so fare from you don't forget it if I Never see you no more on earth I want to meet you in Heaven tel mother that I sav cousin Thomas Winkler lutherday to he was well but he did not know any thing of his Brother Write Soon direct you letters to Richmond at Co. B 18 Ridgment N.C.T 4 Br Gade
