## CONNECTING

Most genealogists spend time trying to connect their ancestors with older generations and, if that is accomplished, then we strive to establish roots in the old or mother country. The search goes on. Sometimes some 'light' is discovered:

THE BARLOW FAMILY OF ENGLAND AND VIRGINIA, A chain of Evidence, is the title of an article by Lundie W Barlow that appeared in THE NATIONAL GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY QUARTERLY, June 1960, p 114-115

This lineage begins with... marriage of Edward Barlow . Sussex to Joan (Rushton (Rishton) 20 Dec 1592 and continues down through HENRY BARLOW, the immigrant, who settled first on the Elizabeth River in Virginia and continued through descendants in Northampton County, VA and through his son, THOMAS BARLOW of Isle of Wight County, VA.

This clears up BARLOWS in two locations, if all the information is correct. See the quarterly in most large genealogical libraries.

ANOTHER clue is furnished by the book BUNCHES OF BARLOWS by John O Hawkins, (see advertisement). At least this line follows those who remained in North Carolina and gives clues to family origins by use of such surnames as: LAXTON, BRAXTON, LIVINGSTON, PARISH & ISBELL in Wilkes and Ashe, Alexander and other counties of NC and to some degree the BARLOWS of parts of Kentucky.

Proximity and linkage of names, gives the editor the 'feeling' that the line of REV JOHN BARLOW may have originated early in King and Queen County before he moved to Albemarle County, VA. Also, it is quite possible that some of the family avoided that jaunt and came directly to Kentucky.

It seems rather well established now that the Culpeper County line in Virginia of BARLER/PARLER were Germanic in origin and became BARLOW, but we welcome all spellings and origins of the name. We also consider to wonder on BARTLOW/BARKLOW and other such spellings.

BOOK REVIEW -CHILD APPRENTICES IN AMERICA, From Christ's Hospital, London, 1617-1778 By Peter Wilson Coldham (1990) is another of the contributions of this famous authority to roots of early Americans. As early as 1617, right through the period of the Revolutionary War, orphaned or homeless children were sent to serve as apprentices in this country. Sometimes these children were enlisted by their parents in hopes of a better life for the child.

The list gives name, parents if known, date of birth, native parish and occupation of father, plus term of 'training'.

"Imprimis I Comit my soul into ye hands of my faythfull Creator upon his pleasing shall be to require it and my body to a Comely buriall. And for my worldly goods my funeral expenses first defrayed and my debts discharged I dispose as followe"

I give and bequeath to my loving wife Anne Barlowe all my Lands housing Cattles of all sorts and all my moveable estate.

I give and bequeathe the premises and every part of them to my Loving sonn John Barlow and to my daughters Elizabeth frost Martha Beers Deborah Sturgis Issable Clapham and Ruth Bradlee to be equally divided among them. And whereas Inconveniences may follow by dividing some parcell of land or particulars Chatties or moveables my will is that whichsoever of the six above named Legatees will give the greatest price for the same shall have it. In witness therof I have hear unto set my hand this eight day of March one thousand six hundred seventy and four.

Witnesses John Barlowe. Seal Robert Romble.

Proved Nov. 3, 1674. Fairfield, Conn. Probata Records, Vol. 1655-75."

It is strange that among these five daughters of John Barlowe, Senior, the name Anne does not occur. And it may be that E. H. J. C., has proofs which I have not been able to find that another daughter existed. Unfortunately my copy of the will of John (2) Barlowe was destroyed by a careless friend; some years ago so that all I have about him is that he married Abigail Lockwood who survived him and that his will was made Jan. 23, 1890 and his estate inventoried March 6, 1890.

I have a note that his son John (3) Barlowe married Ruth Sherwood, daughter of Thomas (2) Sherwood and that she was the widow of Samuel Drake. I cannot now give the proof of Ruth Sherwood's first marriage but hope that it was not destroyed with the basket of other papers and shall try to find it. There seems to be no trace of any children by this Drake marriage and I have wondered if her marriage to him might not have occurred after the death of John (3) Barlowe whom she survived and by whom, judging from all evidence I have, she had all her children. The will of John (3) Barlowe leaves to his loving wife Ruth one third of all his estate during her natural life. Item, my will is that my four sons John, Samuel, Joseph and Francis shall have two third parts of all the remainder of my Estate to be equally divided among them only my son John shall have my bellmetal mortar & pestle more than his brothers my sons to receive their portions when they arrive at Ye age of Twenty one years.

"Item, my Will is that my four daughters Abigail, Ann, Sarah and Deborah shall have the remaining third part of my estate to be equally divided between them they to receive their Portions at ye age of eighteen years or marriage if they are married sooner"

In confirmation whereof I hereunto Set my hand this 31st day of July in ye year of our Lord 1710.

The proof that the wife of John (3) Barlow was Ruth Sherwood, daughter of Thomas Sherwood lies in the following Land Record which Francis (4) Barlow signed with his mother Ruth Barlow which was for a tract of land in Fairfield "which her honored father Thomas Sherwood late of Fairfield had given her"  
Dated Feb. 17, 1725-8. L. R. F.

4421. S. BARLOWE. L. R. F., Aug. 17, 1927. Your article was very interesting to me as I am a direct descendant of this family. I would like to know which John Barlowe was the father of Ann (sometimes spelled Anne) who married Samuel Drake, Sr., of Fairfield, Conn., and afterward in 1663 settled at Eastchester, N. Y. The Journal of the Rev. Elias Constant of the Presbyterian Church of Yorktown, N. Y., page 128, gives the information that they were married Sept. 30, 1660, and that Samuel Drake died at Eastchester in 1686, will probated Nov. 30, 1686. Children: John, born 1656; Samuel, who married Ruth —, settled in Fairfield, Conn.; Joseph, born 1663; Sarah; Mary who married Joannes.

The will of Samuel Drake, Sr., is quoted in Early Wills of Westchester County, N. Y., prior to 1685. Wife not mentioned. His children and grandchildren are provided for, "and the rest of my estate to my son Joseph." This information can be found in Bolton's, Scharf's, and Shownard's Histories of Westchester County, N. Y. References: J. H. Trumbull's Memorial of Hartford, Conn., Vol. 2, page 549. Emery's History of Taunton, Mass. (1893), pages 29-42. John Drake, (father of Samuel) and his wife Elizabeth Rogers, first settled in Plymouth, coming from England in 1630, later going to Windsor, Conn., where he died Aug. 18, 1669 (from Old Windsor Church Record).

K. BARLOW, RAYMOND. Who was Sarah Barlow, born 1746, who in 1769 married Elias Raymond, probably Stamford, Conn. Was she descendant of Ebenezer Barlow, who married granddaughter of Richard Wright, who married Hester Cooke, daughter of Francis?

JOHN<sup>1</sup> BARLOW was an early settler in Fairfield, where he owned land at least as early as 1650. His will, dated 28 Mar. 1674, named his wife ANN; son John; daughters Elizabeth Frost, Martha Beers, Deborah Sturgis, Isabella Clapham, and Ruth Bradley.

He died shortly before 9 June 1674, when his estate was inventoried. The sons-in-law, James Beers, John Sturgis, and Francis Bradley, made an agreement with John Barlow [Jr.], 20 Nov. 1674.<sup>b</sup>

The widow Ann died shortly before 25 Feb. 1684/5, when her estate was inventoried.<sup>b</sup>

John was perhaps brother of Thomas Barlow, who came to Fairfield about the same time, apparently from Windsor.

## Centerville Precinct

**J. T. BARLOW**, farmer P. O. Centerville; was born Jan. 31, 1834, in Boone County, Mo., but has lived in Kentucky since 1849, and is the son of Martin B. and Fanny A. (Cautrill) Barlow. Martin was born in Scott County, Ky., from where he moved to Missouri, but died in Illinois in 1873; his wife was born on the farm where J. T., her son, now lives, and died in 1816; she was a daughter of Joseph Cautrill, Sr. The grandfather of our subject came to Kentucky about 1780, and located in Scott County, entering land and developing the same. Mr. Barlow was married in 1855 to Miss Annie R. Lydick, daughter of Jacob Lydick, of Fayette County, and has five children: Lelia, married to J. B. Ammerman, of Texas; Mollie, married to J. T. Hill, of Bourbon County, now of Texas; Bettie, married to John Stampa, of Bourbon County, now of Texas; Ella and Frankie. Our subject resided in Missouri from 1855 to 1862, since which time he has lived in Kentucky, for a short time in Fayette, afterward in Bourbon; he owns 95 acres of good land, farms in a general way and raises stock; has served as Justice of the Peace seven years in the Centerville Precinct, and is a Democrat. Mrs. Barlow is a member of the Old Union Christian Church, of Fayette County.

**DR. WILLIAM H. BARLOW**; Georgetown; was born in Scott County, Ky., Sept. 13, 1809. He is of Virginia parentage. His father, Thomas H. Barlow, was a substantial farmer. Susannah (Isabel) Barlow was his mother. His father was a particular Baptist; his death occurred in 1825. The subject of this sketch was educated in the Rittenhouse Academy, which afterwards became the Georgetown College. He began the study of medicine at the age of sixteen, with Dr. Alexander C. Keene, of Georgetown, continuing three years. In 1827 he began the practice of his profession in Georgetown, where he has since practiced, in all forty-five years. During the years 1829-30 he was located at Florence, Ky., and from 1832 to 1836 was in Williamstown, Ky. Dr. Barlow is a vegetarian, not having tasted a particle of animal food for thirty-seven years, to which fact he attributes his good health, never having had a headache in his life, and having been confined but five days in his life-time. He has practiced fifty-four years in regular practice, being busy night and day. He never refused to go on account of poverty of both black and white, and to the poor gave his medicine. He has been in attendance at *four thousand* births. In 1881 he retired, feeling that he had done enough actual labor for one life-time. Dr. Henry Craig was a fellow student of his at college, and in the office of Dr. Keene; he was his contemporary in practice. Dr. Barlow has made a study of literature, being familiar with French; he has a large collection of medical works in that language. He has collected a large library of several hundred standard works, with which he is perfectly familiar. In 1827 he married Miss Louisa Allgaier, of Cincinnati, Ohio. They raised nine children, three of whom are still living, viz: Feresia V., wife of Frank A. Lyon, of Lexington, Capt. E. C. Barlow, and Ouida, now Mrs. Harry S. Orr, of Georgetown. Dr. Barlow's father brought the first race-horse to the county; it was Lamplighter. He kept a stallion and bred blooded horses, but was never on the turf.

**CAPT. EDWARD C. BARLOW**, jeweler, Georgetown; was born in Cincinnati, Ohio, in 1829, and was but four years old when his parents returned to Georgetown, Ky., where they had formerly resided; he was educated in the Georgetown College and the Western Military Institute, where he was a pupil of James G. Blaine, then a teacher for Col. Thornton Johnson. Our subject left school in 1849 to learn the jeweler's trade with T. J. Shepard, and in 1851 engaged in the jewelry business; he married in 1851 Miss Sarah Rawlins, daughter of Dr. James Rawlins, of this county. Mr. Barlow pursued his calling at Georgetown until 1863, when he enlisted in the 40th Ky. Mounted Infantry, in which he first served as Adjutant, but was promoted to the Captaincy of Co. "B," in 1864.

He served in the Department of Kentucky, and participated in several engagements with Gen. Morgan and Adam Johnson. He was mustered out and honorably discharged Dec. 31, 1864; on his return Capt. Barlow engaged in the pursuits of civil life, with little interruption except three disastrous fires which occurred respectively, in 1869, 1875 and 1876, destroying his business blocks, and entailing an aggregate loss of \$20,000. In 1875, he built his present business block in which is located Barlow's Hall, at a cost of \$13,000. It is the only public hall in the city, and has a seating capacity of 600. Capt. Barlow has been a member of the City Council since 1862, except two years. He is the active friend of public improvements, and a zealous advocate of common schools. His son, James W., is an active member of the firm of Barlow & Son, which does an extensive business in jewelry, silverware, books and wall-paper.

**ALFRED BARLOW**, farmer; P. O. Oddville; was born in Harrison County, Ky., Oct. 30, 1815, and is the son of Eliphalet and Mildred (Barlow) Barlow. His father was born in Virginia June 1, 1777, and raised in Wilkes County, N. C. In the year 1800 he became a resident of Scott County, Ky., and in the year 1801 was married to the lady named. Nine children were born to them, four of whom are now living: Lewis, Tompkins, Elizabeth and Alfred. Mr. Barlow followed farming and carpentering in Scott County for 3 years, and then removed to Nicholas County, and there engaged in farming until 1807, when he removed to Harrison County, where he resided until his death, which occurred in 1868, on March 20. His mother was a native of Virginia; she became a resident of Nicholas County by the removal of her parents to Kentucky, and died in Harrison county in 1863. The early life of Alfred was spent on his father's farm. Jan. 22, 1839, he married America Barnes.
