NOTES

THE BARLOW FAMILY OF ENGLAND AND VIRGINIA: A CHAIN OF EVIDENCE, 1592-1659

By *Lundie W. Barlow*

The following records constitute an apparently unassailable chain of evidence connecting the Barlow family of Northampton County, Virginia, with the Barlow family of county Sussex, England.¹

1. Sussex Marriage Licenses (Sussex Record Society, vol. 12)—p. 18: 20 December 1592, Edward Barlow and Joan Rushton (Rishton).
2. Assembly Books of Southampton (Southampton Record Society, vol. 1)—p. 15: Edward Barlow . . . burgess in 1593 . . . merchant adventurer . . . free suitor 1603 . . . sheriff 1606 . . . mayor 1607 . . . died 1619-20.
3. Sussex Marriage Licenses (Sussex Record Society, vol. 12)—p. 7: 3 October 1596, Matthew Vaux, Gentleman, and Juliana Barlowe of Chichester, widow . . . Edward Barlowe of the city and county of Southampton, Merchant, surety.
4. Register of St. Michael parish, Southampton: 8 June 1599, Abigail, daughter of Edward Barlow, christened.
5. Sussex Marriage Licenses (Sussex Record Society, vol. 28): 14 November 1600, Robert Rishton of Ernley and Susan, daughter of Allan Cooke of West Button, Gentleman.
6. Register of St. Michael parish, Southampton: 20 October 1601, Henry, son of Edward Barlow, christened.
7. Assembly Books of Southampton (Southampton Record Society, vol. 1)—p. 67: 1 June 1608, letter addressed to "The Right Worshippfull, my verie lovinge friend, Mr. Edward Barlowe, Maior of the Towne of Southampton."

19. Virginia Patent Book 2, p. 184: 5 October 1649, grant to "Mr. Ralph Barlowe" 850 acres, on Great Noswattock River, Northampton County, due for transportation of himselfe severall tymes . . . Ann Parker . . . Robert Parker . . . George Parker."

Ralph Benoni (child of sorrow), posthumous son of Ralph Barlow of Northampton, died young. John Ellsey removed to Maryland and has numerous present generation descendants. Two of the Parker brothers continued on the Eastern Shore of Virginia and founded families still there. Katheryn Barlow, widow, remarried—to one of the Scarbroughs—and left issue by him. Henry Barlow, my immigrant forebear of the name, disappears from the records, in both Virginia and England, after 1659 but his son Thomas settled in Isle of Wight and his progeny are numerous throughout the South today.

1) Many daughters keep alive family links, names and memories as well as pictures-all handed down from generation to generation. Hence the title, 'The Land Bridge'.

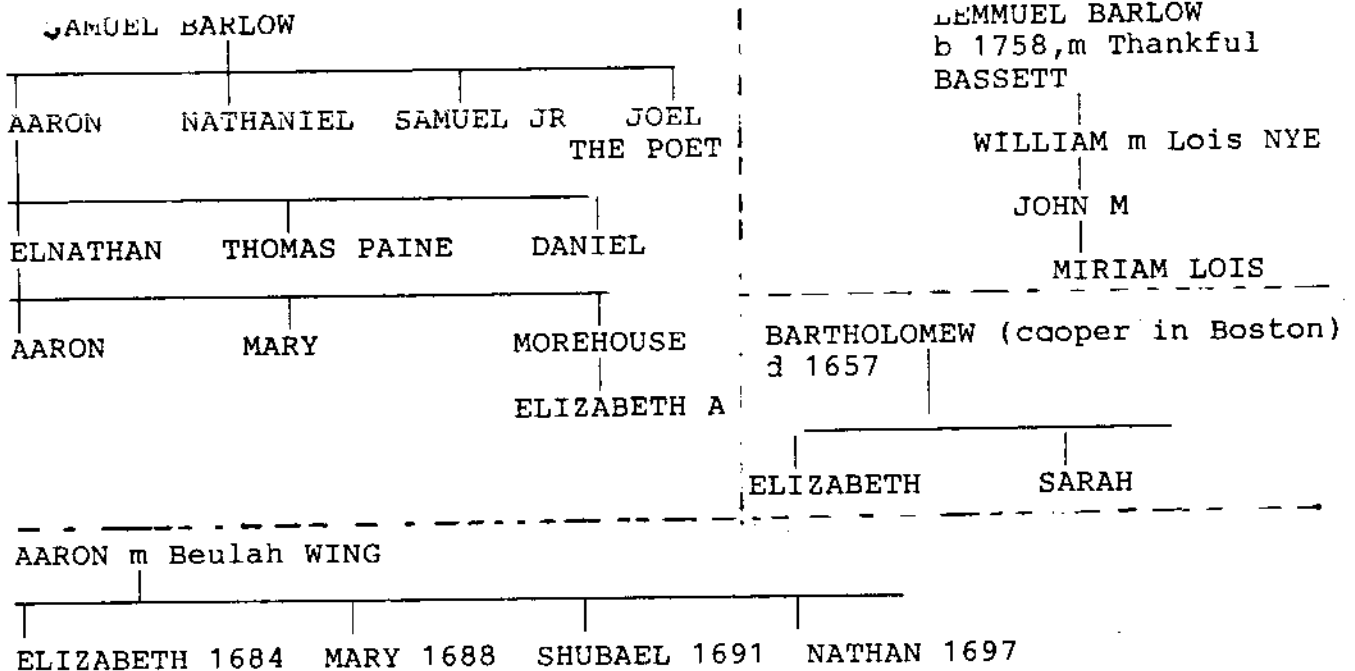
Excerpts from letters of Mrs Wm H Smith, 324 Queensway Drive, Lexington, KY 40502

"...I cannot go beyond HENRY BARLOW, m Judith (who?) and were in Scott County, KY., (Woodford County then) in 1785. Their chn: JAMES, m and went to Louisiana; MILDRED, unm; THOMAS, m Susan Childs ISBELL, ELIZABETH, first wife of John LAND (my line), HENRY JR., m Ann or Nancy (interchangeable) perhaps REYNOLDS, FRANKEY (FRANCES) m Woodford Samuel SHEPARD and WILLIAM, unm?

HENRY and JUDITH supposed to have come from Albemarle County, VA... as my grandfather's brother was HENRY BARLOW LAND and JAMES? BARLOW was mentioned in settlement of John Land's estate. We think the wife of John Land was a RENFRO (last wife) and had chn: FOUNTAIN and CECELIA LAND... John and Betsy LAND had nine children and she may have died at birth of last one... HENRY was son of John AND Betty LAND: m Nellie HOSACK/HOSSICK/HOSEK in Madison County, KY. Their second son, WILLIAM FOUNTAIN LAND was my great grandfather, his gs had same name and a cousin is named 'FOUNT' Baker... JAMES of LA had ELIZABETH BARLOW, m ROSS; POLLY m DAVENPORT, FOUNTAIN BARLOW; LUCRETIA m Mr HEWITT; AMANDA m a KNOX and LUCINDY m a man named LEWIS.

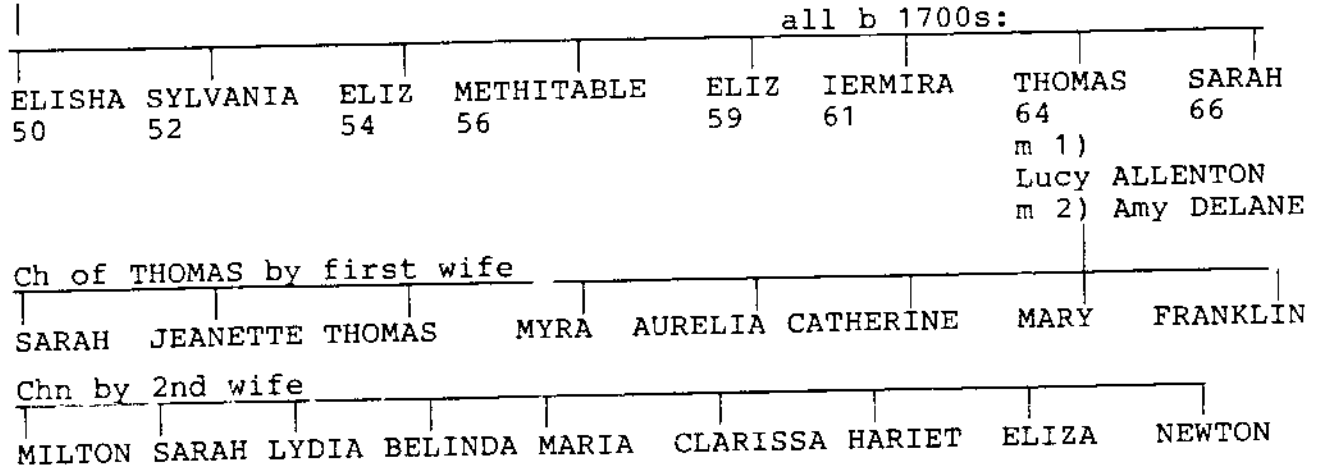
... FOUNTAIN WILLIAM LAND (name reversed above by mistake) had a sister, LUCINDA LAND married a man named ROBERTS." (One should write Mrs Smith for additional information, also see book by Carlton. Also check with Patricia O'Boyle, see under New member)

Other charts as per Nathan L Barlow, labled 'Independent Lines' and location not stated, probably in New England or NY?

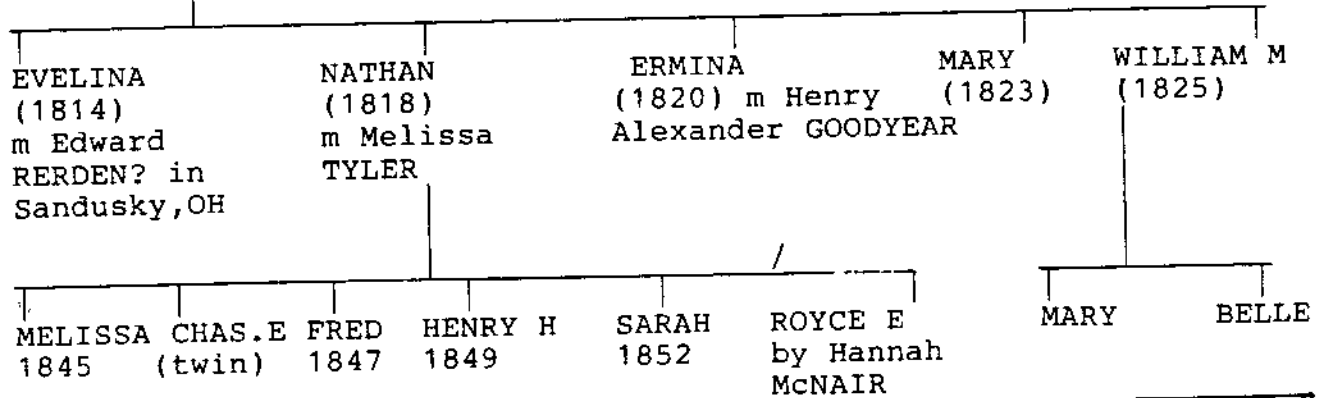

These charts supplied by Nathan L Barlow, Star Route 2 Box 359, Rison, AR 71665 (1986) to Misty Drain. In his letter he says, "I have other information on BARLOW'S of Texas, Kentucky, NC, VA AND IL."

Query from new member, Bobbie Dunbar, Rt 73, Box 792, Richland, MO 65556, 15 Apr 1991:

Who is he? Who were his parents? JOHN BARLOW b ca 1832, maybe in Mexico. Lived in Kansas Indian Territory, married four times to Indian women: 1) Eliza GREEN, Shawnee; 2) Lydia KEEN, Shawnee and 3)-4) Minta BEN, Cherokee. In 1870, he moved to Vintia, OK with the Shawnee Tribe and last known date places him there in 1910. Known children (perhaps others?): MARTHA, PHEBE, JULIA, JULIAS.

Letter from Elizabeth J Overman, 6045 S W 56th Court, Ocala, FL 32674 (briefed):

"...WILLIAM H BARLOW, I believe, (see p 70) is a brother of LAVINIA BARLOW... J T BARLOW is son of MARTIN BOLAR BARLOW and his wife, Fanny A (CANTRILL/CANTRELL... he died in Illinois in 1875... I see CAPT EDWARD C BARLOW is another son... DR WILLIAM H BARLOW is on Census Scott County, Ky., correct, (see 1850)... wife, 'LETTIA' I believe is nickname for LOUISA J ALLAGIER. Note extract has, 'T LYON, 20, FRANCIS 27 in hh' The couple had a daughter, FERESA V., wife of Frank A LYON. That should likely be TERESA and the young LYONS their children, William 3 and Anson, 1... FRANCIS must be FRANK LYON.

Correction to FALL & WINTER, 1990- Robert Carlton HOUSTON d 17 Dec 1957 in Clinton, Indiana (not IA). Who (see p 47) was doing the write-up? Also, Who died in 1805 and who in 1778? ..I had James ISBELL, b 1730 with wife, LUCY? ...then I noticed that his wife might be Frances Tompkins LIVINGSTON..."

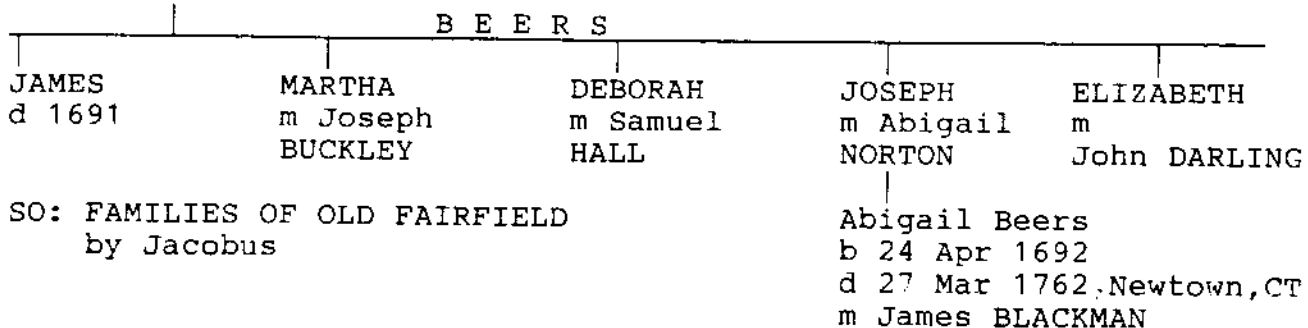

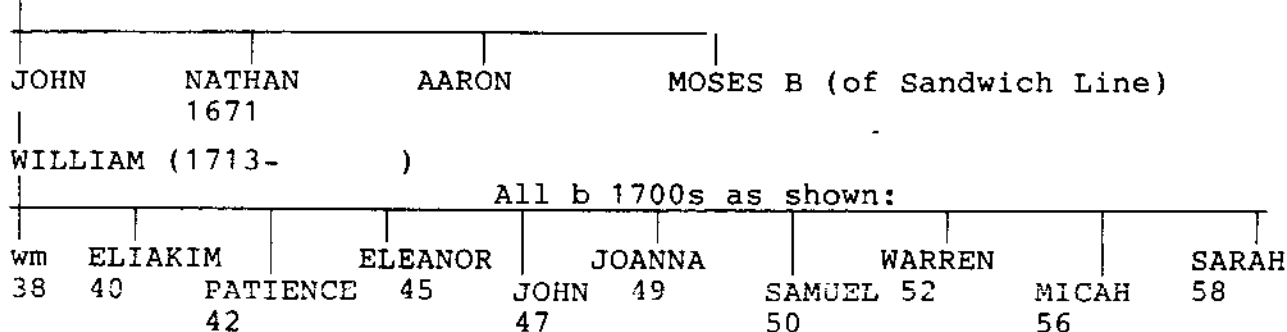

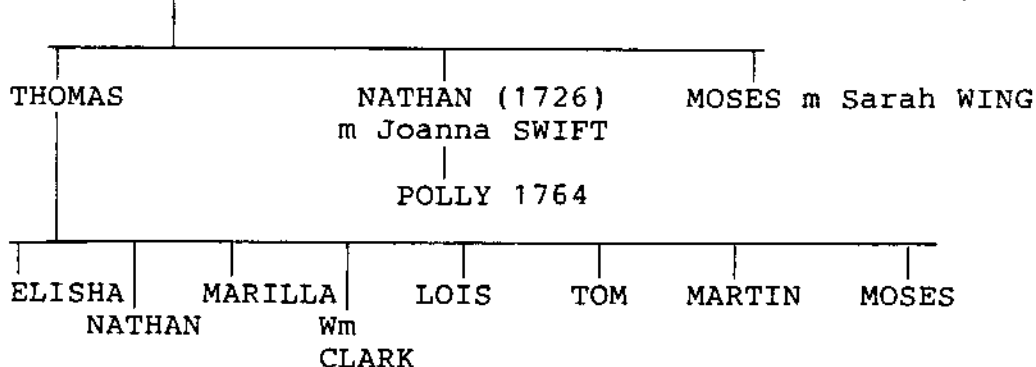

This Carlton Family History is the results of ten years of research and has been published for the benefit of both family descendants and genealogical researchers. It is a labor of love that combined thousand of miles travelled, research in dozens of courthouses, cemeteries, libraries, hundreds of hours reading microfilm and an unending correspondence with cousins, governmental agencies and other researchers. It is written as a personal journey of the author in his search for his ancestors who were here before the American Revolution. The 7 by 9 hardbound volume contains over 235 pages with photographs, maps, early marriage bonds and other official documents with the ancestors signatures. The book uses archival quality paper and was typeset using the latest desktop publishing technology. It has a full name index of over 17 pages of names. Every effort has been made to document the sources of information on the families.

John Carlton is the oldest proven Carlton ancestor of the author. John was born ca. 1720, probably in Virginia. He is listed as a Planter of Orange County Virginia in 1761 when he and Henry Barlow bought 400 acres in Albemarle County, Virginia. Family tradition say that John married Elizabeth Wallace ca. 1745 in Virginia and that he died ca. 1766 or about ten years before the revolution.

The five children of this marriage—Elizabeth, Thomas, Lewis, John and Ambrose—left Virginia during the Revolutionary War. Elizabeth is believed to have married Thomas Barlow and moved to Scott and Nicholas Counties Kentucky with other Barlow families. The four sons and their mother, Elizabeth, were in Wilkes County, North Carolina between 1778 and 1780. The family tradition that said all four sons served in the American Revolution has been proven for three of them and is probably true for the fourth son. The related families of Barlow, Burch, Isbell, Land, Livingston and others also moved to Wilkes County about the same time from Virginia. Most of these families had something else in common, that of being early Baptists.

The author is an eighth generation descendant of the earliest John Carlton and is retired from the United States Air Force.
